The JOURNAL is never an uncertain element in a political fight. It is always positive for or against some one thing that the people are vitally interested in.

The JOURNAL opposed Mr. Dolph for senator because his managers tried to run a cinch cause and because "he had the temerity to disregard the expressed wish of the people of Oregon" on the money question.
