**THE INDIAN WAR VETERANS' CRAFT.**

SIDNEY, N. S. W., Jan. 21.—The Australians are very anxious to have Sir Wilfrid Laurier, of the Dominion of Canada, with them upon the inauguration of their new Australian Confederation Parliament. Sent the First Message.  
New York, Jan. 21.—Telegraphers remember this day as that of the death a year ago of the author of the first message sent over the telegraph line between Washington and Baltimore. Mrs. Rosewell Smith, wife of Rosewell Smith, who founded Scribner's Monthly and afterwards changed it to the "Century Magazine," was, as a girl of seventeen, privileged to carry to Professor Samuel F. B. Morse the news of the passage of the bill by Congress that provided for the construction of the first telegraph line in the country. Prof. Morse rewarded her for her kindly zeal by allowing Miss Ellsworth to write the first message to go over the wire. By advice of her mother she wrote down the words of the Palimpsest, "What hath God wrought?" and they were dotted and lined out in triplicate from Washington and Baltimore. Miss Ellsworth always kept the original copy. The duplicate is in the possession of the Connecticut Historical Rooms at Hartford.
