WOULD PROTECT THE FARMERS

Measures to Prevent Loss of Grain in Warehouses.

Bills That Have Been Introduced Having That Object in View.

There are now pending in the legislature four bills bearing on the control of warehouses for the storage of grain and the passage of such of them as are favorably reported by the committee will undoubtedly result in the extending of that protection to the farmer that has so long been called for. In the Senate a bill has already been passed, the principal part of which is the requirement of monthly inspection and report of grain stored. The bill was introduced by Senator Adams. It provides that every warehouse, flooring mill, grist mill or other place wherein grain is kept for storage or hire make a report to the county court on the first day of each month containing a statement of the amount of grain owned by the Company on the first day of the month preceding the report, the amount of grain bought for cash, received by exchange, shipped, ground or otherwise disposed of during the month. If from the report it appears that there is a shortage in the grain on storage, a member of the county court shall be appointed to examine the books and affairs of the warehouse, the cost to be upon the corporation, unless no shortage is found to exist. If a shortage is found, an order will be issued to show cause why a receiver should not be appointed. Any person willfully and knowingly making a false report will be subject to a fine or imprisonment or both.

The farmers of Marion county know from past experience the necessity for the most stringent laws regulating the storage of grain. In fact such protection was a strong element in the canvass preceding the election, and the candidates pledged themselves to accomplish this result. In the past year over 150,000 bushels of wheat were lost to the farmers of the county through shortages in warehouses, and the criminal recalcitancy of the managers thereof.

Of the bills introduced in the House the one by J. N. Smith, of Marion, is the most comprehensive in its scope. It provides for increasing the amount of the bonds imposed upon the warehousemen, which will be equal to 15 per cent of the annual volume of business with the minimum bond to be at \$3000. Another by Mr. McCracken, of Portland, provides for similar regulations to be applied to the warehouses of Multnomah county.

PECULIAR CASE OF MISS MULKEY

Miss Susan Mulkey, niece of the late United States Senator J. N. Dolph, shot herself with a revolver at San Francisco, a few days ago, and died soon afterward at a hospital from the wound. She is a daughter of C. J. Mulkey, formerly special agent of the Treasury Department, and is a cousin of Congressman F. Mulkey and Chester Dolph, of Portland. She was also distantly connected with the Mulkeys of this section.

Miss Mulkey and her mother had recently arrived in San Francisco from Tacoma, Wash., and their business there was to dispose of some mining property acquired by Miss Mulkey. The property was located at Nume. Her attorney made an unfavorable report regarding the property and the young lady seemed quite hysterical over the matter. At a later hour he called again and found the young lady in much the same mood. She requested her mother and the attorney to leave her to rest and quietude and she would recover. They departed and a few moments later heard a shot, and hastening back found her lying in a pool of blood with a revolver at her side. She died without giving any reason for the deed. A peculiar phase of the case in the fact that the mother and daughter registered at the Royal House, in San Francisco, under the assumed name of Mrs. Millsap and daughter. The young lady was about 20 years of age.

C. J. Mulkey, father of the dead girl, formerly special agent of the Treasury Department, was implicated in the famous smuggling case several years ago, along with other government officers, when Nat Blum was a star witness, and related much sensational testimony. Mrs. Mulkey was a sister of the late Senator Dolph.

The Corvallis Gazette says she had relatives at that place.
