CANAL NEGOTIATIONS HAVE BEEN RESUMED

Secretary Hay Will Try to Formulate a Treaty Acceptable all Around

HE IS MAKING A CANVASS OF THE SENATORS ON THE SUBJECT

Military Frauds are Being Unearthed and Will be Punished at Manila--Island of Panay Guilty of a Patriotic Demonstration and Unanimous for the Government

WASHINGTON, April 13.—There is authority for the following statement of the status of canal negotiations: After adjournment of the Senate, and lapse of the Hay-Pauncefote treaty, Secretary Hay decided to pursue the subject further. He concluded to first consult the ratifying power of the Senate to ascertain if it was possible for the Senate to agree upon the basis of a treaty which should be acceptable to the executive branch of the Government and to Great Britain.

Hay is devoting himself now to ascertaining of feelings and desires of Senators and not having completed work has not begun negotiations for a new treaty. The State Department will not be able to acquit Lord Pauncefote with the basis upon which it is willing to negotiate for a treaty before the ambassador sails for London next June.

MANILA, April 13.—The trial of Sergeant Memson, first case in commissary scandals, began with the startling disclosures expected. Two witnesses testified that quantities of flour were taken from the government warehouse and sold by the commissary Sergeants and two others. The extent of illegal sales has not been ascertained.

SAN JOSE DE BUENA VISTA, Panay Island, April 13.—When the Philippine Commission arrived here today every village of this antique province was represented by delegates. The statue of liberty, erected on the principal square had pictures of Abraham Lincoln, the president McKinley and Judge Taft on the pedestal.

Province has been wholly pacified and the aspiration for a provincial form of government is unanimous.

THE AMERICAN TOBACCO CO.

Buys out the American Cigar Company.

First Steps Taken Forming Another Combine on Smoke.

Also Has Control of Cigarettes, Snuff and Plug Tobacco.

NEW YORK, April 13.—The World says: The American Cigar Company which was recently purchased by the American Tobacco Company has made final arrangements for the absorption of the Havana-American Company. The last named company was organized with a capital of \$10,000,000 in November, 1899 under the laws of New Jersey, for the manufacture of cigars. The terms of transfer, it is said, have been satisfactorily arranged and it only remains for the legal documents to be signed in order that the deal shall become effective.

By the absorption of the Havana American Company, the American Cigar Company, which already controls the manufacture of cigarettes, snuff and plug tobacco, will make a big stride toward controlling the cigar trade as well. One of the immediate results promised to the smoker is a slight reduction in the retail price of cigars. The importance of the combination is indicated by the name of the firm represented in the directorate of the Havana American Company. These include Heru-shen's Brothers & Company, of New Orleans; the Ybor Hanrahan Company of Key West; Seidenberg & Company and Julius Ellinger & Company of Tampa; Eugene Volleens & Company of Chicago and Rosener, Arnold & Company of Key West. The American Cigar Company was incorporated in January, 1899 and was capitalized at \$70,000,000. It also was a combination of many manufacturers who had previously been doing an independent business.

The independent cigar manufacturers say they have no fear of the combination. There are hundreds of small factories in New York City and vicinity. The owners say that as they make local brands that are in popular favor their brands cannot be easily displaced by the trust.

KILLED WITH HIS OWN GUN

Lindsay Shelton, of Elgin, son of Andy Shelton, was yesterday found dead about one mile from home, with his thumb shot off and a hole through his body from the left side of the abdomen to the right breast through which the discharge from his shotgun had torn, says the La Grand Chronicle. His gun was found about a half a mile away and he had evidently dragged himself painfully over this distance in order to reach the roadside before expiring. Shelton had gone out hunting about 6 o'clock and was found dead about 3 o'clock in the afternoon, by some boys who had discovered the bloody trail. It was evident that he had been climbing over a log while dragging his gun by the muzzle, when the gun was discharged with fatal effect. His dog had remained faithfully with him and would scarcely permit the approach of the boys to the body.

AGUINALDO'S DELAY IS UNEXPLAINED

MacArthur Has not Been Able to Persuade Him to Sign Up

THREATENED WITH ASSASSINATION FOR HAVING CAUSED DEATH OF LUNA

Hundred and Fifty Volunteers Reported to Have Deserted Because They Fear There Will be no More Fighting in the Philippines--Will be Recovered by the Regulars

NEW YORK, April 13.—A special to the Herald from Washington says: Aguinaldo's delay in issuing the manifesto advising general surrender of insurgents and delivering of arms and their acceptance of American sovereignty is causing comment.

Officials of the War Department asserting their faith in General MacArthur's ability to induce Aguinaldo to issue the desired address. Aguinaldo has demanded certain conditions as a preliminary to this action and a discussion has occurred on the points which he has named.

Before the address is issued, it is expected it will be cabled in full to the Secretary of War for submission to the President and will be amended by the authorities here if amendment is desirable.

Under instructions General MacArthur is closely guarding Aguinaldo both to prevent his escape and to prevent any injury being done him by friends of the late Lieutenant General Luna. Lieutenant Colonel Clarence Edwards who was the Adjutant General of Gen. Luna's column said that there seems to be very little doubt Aguinaldo had given instructions for the death of Luna was killed in Cabañatuan by one of Aguinaldo's body guard who had been drawn up in honor of the insurgent General who, Colonel Edwards said was "the Lawton of the Philippine service." Aguinaldo had sent a peace commissioner to treat with the Americans but Luna arrested some of them and sent some of his own commission. Jealous of his popularity with the army and desiring to provide for himself the dictatorship, Aguinaldo, Colonel Edwards added, is believed to have given the orders which resulted in his rival's assassination. Luna had many friends and it would not surprise officers here should an attempt be made on Aguinaldo's life in revenge for the assassination of the popular insurgent officer.
