AMERICAN TRADE IN AFRICA

Mr. Frederick Emery, chief of the bureau of foreign commerce of the State Department makes public today the second chapter of "Commercial Relations of the United States with Africa. The chapter is made up of trade testimony from our United States Consuls stationed at favorable points of observation at all points of the compass on the continent. Consul Kidder of Algiers says: "I am convinced that a more certain market for American products adapted to the wants of the country does not exist on this side of the Atlantic than is offered by Algeria. The commerce is controlled by European houses and the most improved farming implements are in increasing demand. The best tools at the lowest prices can be sold here regardless of where they come from. "American food products are sold to some extent through branch houses in France and popular wherever used. A grocery, dealing exclusively in our food products with some one to demonstrate methods of cooking would be a great success. In short there is hardly an article of any growth or manufacture which would not be appreciated here if presented in the proper way. The greatest drawback to trade is the lack of a direct steamship line."

Attorney and Client.
A party who deals with an attorney lawfully in possession of his client's property has the right to act on appearances, and is not chargeable with private instructions to the attorney. 64 Pac. Rep. (Wyo.) 673.

Contractors.
Where three responsible contractors without fraud or collusion submitted bids to make a public improvement for the same sum of money, and after the opening of the bids agreed among themselves that each should submit a written proposition to pay a certain sum to each of the others to secure the contract, and whichever offered the most should have it, such agreement was opposed to public policy and void, and the amount which the party receiving the contract agreed to pay to the other contractors could not be recovered by them. 60 N. E. Rep. (Ill.) 81.

Botelkeepers.
A statute regulating the number of people a lodging house keeper may permit to sleep in one room contravenes Const. 1870, art. 2, § 17, guaranteeing that no person shall be deprived of property without due process of law, being discriminatory against lodging house keepers as a class, and exempting keepers of public entertainment, such as luns, hotels, and boarding houses. 60 N. E. Rep. (Ill.) 88.

Newspapers.
A contract which originates in an advertisement or offer addressed to the public generally, and, if the offer is accepted by any one in good faith, without qualifications or conditions, it will be sufficient to recover the offer into a binding obligation. 64 Pac. Rep. (Kan.) 612.

Police Officers.
The power conferred on the police board of the former city of New York to promote a member of the police force for special acts of heroism, and his right to receive such promotion, is unaffected
