Judicial Decisions

Banks and Banking When, by the terms of a contract of deposit, money is received on deposit in the name of the daughter of the depositor, with the agreement that he (the depositor) may draw such deposit on checks signed by him, and he does draw the money so deposited on checks so signed, the daughter cannot hold the bank for the money so deposited and drawn out. 64 Pac. Rep. (Idaho) 888.

Beneficial Associations Where a portion of certain property owned by a charitable institution is occupied and used by it for charitable purposes, and the remaining portion thereof is devoted to purposes of revenue, the portion used is subject to taxation. 64 Pac. Rep. (Utah) 961.

Building and Loan Association A contract with a building and loan association, requiring a fixed monthly payment of dues, and a certain premium aggregating an amount greater than the legal rate of interest, is unenforceable, the premium being merely additional interest. 29 Mo. Rep. (Miss.) 825.

Dairy Interests In the prosecution of a person charged with selling adulterated milk it was not necessary to aver or prove that the milk in question was to the knowledge of the defendant, below the required standard. It is competent for the legislature to declare that the doing of an act shall subject the doer thereof to a penalty, irrespective of his motive or knowledge, and in such a case the courts have no power to require proof of knowledge or motive to be shown. 49 At. Rep. (N. Y.) 16.

Landlord and Tenant. In an action to recover damages for the failure to give possession of leased property, the measure of damages is the difference between the leased rental value and the rent reserved, where the premises were necessary to the plaintiff for the purpose of carrying on a new business since there could be no basis on which to estimate the profits. 64 Pac. Rep. (Wash.) 914.

Personal Injury Suit. Entering the elevator which is apparently at rest and with the door open, and which the passenger has no reason to suppose can be started until the door is closed, is not negligence, though the elevator is moving, which could have been determined by momentary observation of the car and machinery. 49 At. Rep. (R. I.) 728.

Railroads One of plaintiff's steers was injured while being unloaded from a car of the defendant company, by reason of a defective chute. The cattle were shipped under a uniform live-stock contract which allowed plaintiff a lower rate in consideration that he load and unload the cattle at his own risk. Held, that a charge that if the jury found that plaintiff had entered into the uniform live stock contract, he could not recover, was proper. 49 At. Rep. (Con) 57.

Shipping and Marine. Ocean-going tugs owned by a lumber company, and exclusively used within the state, and managed and operated by residents of the state, are subject to state taxation, though such tugs are registered at a port situated in a foreign state. 64 Pac. Rep. (Wash.) 909.
