BERRY AND CREAM DAY AT SALEM

Splendid Display of About Fifty Varieties of Strawberries.

ONE GROWER HAS A SHOW OF THIRTY DIFFERENT KINDS

Dairy Meeting at Three O'clock Has a Large Attendance - City Full of Fruit Growers and Dairymen From All Parts of the Valley.

Mr. Smith of Minnesota confessed that the strawberry growers had perpetrated a very agreeable surprise on him in putting up a record-breaking show. Salem people are accustomed to seeing fine displays of berries right in front of the grocery stores all the week though but even to Salemites the show berries and plants are a surprise.

With the aid of the Ladies Auxiliary, the old red front is a perfect bower of roses, rosy red berries, and bunting. Along the right wall is a bank of the McKinley strawberry in fruit and in bloom. On each side are tables and crates of berries. A Rambler wheel decorated with Rambler roses fills the front window. In the rear is a pneumatic tired vehicle wreathed in roses.

A full description of the exhibits and award of prizes will be given Monday. At two o'clock the berry show was closed and Mr. Smith of Minnesota gave a lecture on dairy farming and improved homes for the rural population.

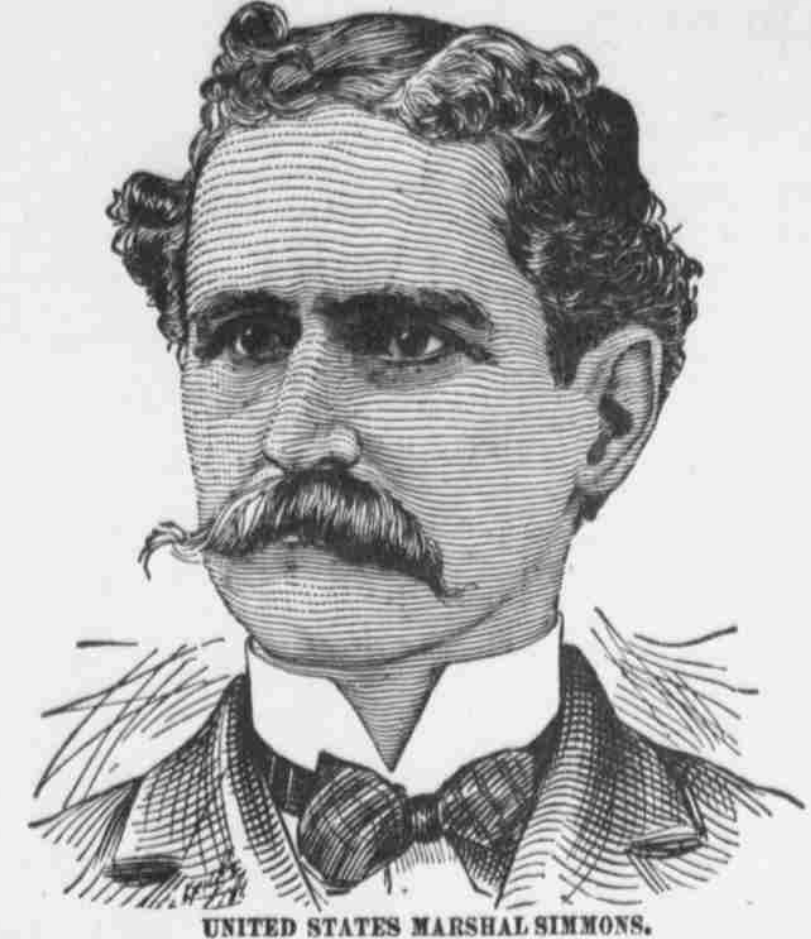

The Perfect Hitch of the McCormick Mower

The greatest problem in the construction of a mower is to give the machine proper balance—to avoid neckweight and side draft, and to sustain the bar so it may be drawn forward through the grass with the least possible amount of dragging friction and resistance. A careful comparison of the McCormick with other mowers will show the remarkable fact that the McCormick is the only mower in the world that is perfectly balanced.

The cutter bar on a mower acts like a long lever. The center of resistance in the work to be performed is removed several feet from the line of draft, a condition that is not found in any other machine used in agriculture. The power of the team must be so applied to the machine that it will reach this center of resistance. Otherwise the machine will have side draft, neckweight and a dozen other disagreeable ills that afflict cheaply constructed mowers. The perfect hitch of the McCormick mower has solved this problem. The power of the team is divided on two lines of draft. The doubletrees are set under the pole in a hinged draft plate, which is connected at its upper end with the pole, and at its lower end with a draft rod which draws directly on the inner shoe of the bar. The upper line of draft draws the machine forward and furnishes power to operate the knife, while the lower line of force runs directly to the bar, drawing upward on it so as to make it float lightly over the ground with the least possible amount of friction.

Other manufacturers come as near as they dare to copying our construction, and build machines with the deliberate intention of making them look like the McCormick, so they will sell, but they don't work like the McCormick. Be kind to your horses—buy the McCormick.
