CREDITORS WIN FIRST ROUND

Plea in Abatement Against Bankruptcy Proceedings Knocked Out.

Salem, July 5.—The Gilbert case had another inning before Judge Bellinger today. Arguments were made in the plea of abatement, which had been set for hearing. The result was a score for petitioning creditors. The court held the plea was defective in so far as it was double pleading. The plea of A. T. Gilbert was consequently ruled out, with the plea in abatement filed by the attorney for the protesting creditors. The court granted five days in which to file new papers and stated that the new papers would be in the nature of a plea in abatement, which appears to be a favorite mode of procedure in this much mixed case. From the statements in court the new papers are to assume the form of a great extent, of those just decreed defenseless by the court. This supposition finds apparent confirmation in a declaration that objection would be made to the petitioning creditors, because some are alleged to be preferred creditors. Papers similar to this were filed sometime ago.

It was not stated that the bank was solvent, yet it is intimated by an opposing attorney that as soon as the bank makes such showing the litigation will flatten out instantly.

H. J. Bigger presented the case of petitioners, while Carson & Jeffrey filed a brief. The ruling of the court was in effect that the suit conducted by Mr. Ford in the state courts was entirely irrelevant and had nothing to do with the case before the federal court. J. N. Brown and W. S. Slater appeared for Ford and Gatch. The five days granted to file an amended answer relate to the proposition of the defense that a number of petitioners were disqualified on account of having drawn funds out of the bank within four months prior to its suspension. This will have to be in by July 11th.
