DISH WATER TRIAL

At the trial in Justice Judah's court yesterday, in which Mrs. Maggie Whitlock was the complainant and Mrs. Amos Ramey the defendant, a verdict of not guilty was found by the jurors, who were five in number as appended: Herman Barr, William Fennell, L. C. Nibler, T. K. Ford and P. Fennell. This jury was drawn after panel of twenty six had been exhausted. P. H. D'Arcy was attorney for the defense and John Jeffrey for the city, and the efficiency with which they handled the case was certainly worthy of a better case.

The parties of the suit are residents of this city, living on South Commercial street, and on adjoining lots. They were at one time friends, the trouble between them having its beginning about eight week ago over a trivial matter and since that time, much ill-feeling has been exhibited between them and to judge from the testimony a few pairs of old shoes and a several sticks of wood exchanged.

About twelve witnesses were examined and considerable irrelevant testimony introduced and especially were several attempts made to besmirch the character and integrity of the parties involved.

The immediate cause of the action was the allegation that dishwater and refuse matter had been thrown by the defendant on to the porch and steps of the complainant.

The trial occupied four hours time.
