**In Interest of Mining Industry.**  
Boise, Idaho, July 23.—The fourth annual session of the International Mining Congress began in this city today and will continue through Thursday. The object of the Congress is to stimulate all forms of mining, not only those for gold and silver, but also for all other kinds of minerals. It aims to secure better recognition of the mining industry from the government, to bring about needed changes in federal mining laws, and to cultivate a friendly feeling and co-operation among those interested in the search for minerals. Delegates are in attendance from nearly every state and territory of the Union, and also from Canada and Mexico. New Mexico, Colorado, Pennsylvania, Oregon, Idaho, Wyoming, Missouri, California, Illinois and Arizona are especially well represented. The present Congress will give special attention to the consideration of ways and means for securing the creation of a cabinet department devoted to mines and mining. In conjunction with the gathering there is being held an elaborate exhibit of ores, mining machinery, etc. Following the close of the sessions the delegates have arranged for side trips to the Yellowstone Park, Shoshone Falls, and other points of interest in the Idaho and Montana country, including the noted mines of the two states and also those in the vicinity of Baker City, Ore. The contestants for the next place of meeting are Oregon, Missouri, California, Tennessee and Ohio. At the formal opening today the visitors were cordially welcomed by Governor Hunt, of Idaho, and Mayor Richards, of Boise.

# PARDONED CONVICTS CHARACTER

Questioned by a Eugene Paper on an Evident Misunderstanding of the Case.

J. M. Benington, the sleek individual, who six years ago ingratiated himself into the good graces of prominent Eugene people, for ulterior motives, and who was arrested at Springfield on the evening of December 22, 1914, for the crime of forgery for which he has just recently served a sentence committed from ten to five years in the Salem penitentiary on account of good behavior, has been heard from again.

It seems that during his incarceration in that institution Benington served as confidential clerk for the stove foundry located at the penitentiary. After serving in this capacity for several months after his pardon, Benington suddenly disappeared together with \$500 of the stove foundry company's funds. He has not been seen or heard from since.—Eugene Register.

Mr. Benington was a man well liked in this city, where he made warm friends. Authorities at the penitentiary state that his action of leaving that place was not criminal, but was the result of a disagreement there. He is not wanted by the police on any account. After his departure from here all of his small bills were paid at his request, and he probably stands in a better light than the above report would indicate.
