EDITORIALS.

There are several reasons why Geer cannot be re-nominated for Governor. In the first place he is a Marion County man and as such he ought to have known that the Aylman and Pen and Reform school belonged to appointees from this county as well as the State Fair Board and Textbook commission. What didn't belong here belonged across the river to Polk county. In all his appointments he has acted as though he didn't know but what the rest of the state had something to do with his nomination and election and was ignorant of the fact that Salem and Marion county was the whole thing. This idea got an early start in his brain and has kept possessing him right straight through, and he simply can't depend on Marion county alone to do the nominating act. Another thing, that operates against him is that he does not wear a gold bangle as large as a brick on his waist-coat, but is just an ordinary common three-linker from wayback and they are not the real thing for the big offices. Some man who carries a thing like a broadaxe hung on a dog chain dangling between his legs that almost trips him up once in a while when he walks around in the hotel lobbies is hot stuff and proves that the wearer got the political microbe in his system early in life. There's Phil Metcahan who was born with a bangle of office, he will be Governor or Congressman or Senator and he can't help it. Geer has no show in a race against destiny, and he might as well quit. Another mistake has been that he has an idea that the people do the nominating and he has made his appointments with that in view, and has helped run the school land board and the state fair and the soldier's home and the schoolbook business entirely regardless of the gang who work the machine and who put men on the ticket. The fellows who work politics for all there is in it will see such a man in the hot place before they give him a second term. What is a Governor for but to feed the hungry and swell the thrifty and make places for the needy? Of course, a good business administration that has saved money for the taxpayer all along the line, that hasn't made loans of the school funds on a political basis, and didn't sell the sacred cause of public education to the highest bidder for the campaign fund, will be a nice thing to talk about in the Republican campaign, but Geer can do that for some one of the gang just as well as for himself. The Republicans have never given a Governor a second term, and if it was done for Geer it might put the thing clear out of reach for some deserving man and be an endorsement of a business administration fatal to a variety of grafts that have not yet been started. The record of a business governor is a reflection on the three million legislature, and the people might get to asking the same kind of thing in every department of government. These are some of the reasons why the gang that are so largely in control of the Republican conventions will sit down on Geer. The first crack out of the box, one of the boozie gang in the last legislature will want the nomination for senator. Having carried that, they will name one of the same crowd for governor, some man who would not have vetoed the charter to turn the City of Portland over to the Democrats as Geer did. The legislative gang will have to carry the convention in order to keep the country Republicans, who do the voting and look the bills, from condemning the whole business and putting a more conservative class of Republicans on deck and that would never do business for the Boozie crowd of patriots.

The will of the late Pierre Lorillard, the tobacco millionaire, is to be contested by his heirs because he left his famous Rancocas stock farm to a woman who enjoyed his friendship and confidence for a matter of fifteen years. It seems he had an attachment for a Mrs. Lilly Allen that has materialized in con-

crete affection to the amount of about half a million dollars worth of property. If Lorillard had been a poor fellow and merely left her a pretty letter or a poem no one could have kicked, but to have his good will for his woman friend take a shape that is not purely Platonic will never do, and the courts will have to overthrow the affair. He should have given that stock farm to some man friend and, no one would have had a chance to say boo, but it is prima facie evidence of insanity and will never do to give it to one of the sex that wears open-work lace shirt waists in summer time. When one of that kind gets a man's confidence and remains his firm friend through thick and thin for fifteen years, waits on him when he is sick or fondles him in his cottage, it is evident right on the face of it that she is a villain and had only selfish designs. Of course, a man like Lorillard was too rich for all his family not to be on speaking terms with him, even though they knew the Allen woman was virtually installed as mistress of the Rancocas stock farm, and that the friendship between the two had broken up the families of both of them more or less. But the point that the whole row is over is that Mr. Lorillard should have had a friend who did not wear trousers, even though her advice and judgment was the best in the world, and she had acted as his adviser in all his business affairs for ten years or more. Although Mrs. Allen is a daughter of General Barnes and connected with high society in New York, the fact that she got thick with a foreign born tobaccoist and is a woman besides is against her. It is true, she couldn't help having been born of that sex, but because she was, she had no business to be the true friend of a man like Lorillard. Besides she is a widow, and that is enough to stamp her as a designing person to begin with, and ought alone be enough to break the will in any male court of justice. Everything seems to favor the proceeding to stamp Mrs. Allen as an adventuress, for besides being a widow she is a handsome appearing woman and is even well informed, something she has really no business to be if she hopes to escape censure. A woman who possesses beauty and accomplishments and wonderful tact and such-like should by law be prohibited from ever being introduced to a millionaire or being his devoted friend and business adviser. Lorillard could have done as many millionaires do, have a mistress, and lavish wealth on her by the barrel in the form of greenbacks and diamonds, but for him to have acknowledged his woman friend openly and publicly in his will is an outrage on society, and to protect society against men doing openly and publicly what seemed to have been carried on in secret the will no doubt will be broken. Mrs. Allen had no business to be a widow and a woman besides, and Lorillard should not have had the bad manners to remember a devoted friend who has the misfortune to not wear bifurcated garments. Discrimination against women is because they are not men and it will not do to undertake in court or the newspapers to give any other grounds for it.

Some one sends us a pamphlet setting forth the advantages of the Eugene Divinity school. We knew that the Athens on the banks of the upriver was a great seat of learning and was destitute of a brewery and had lost its one-mule car-line, but few people know that it has such a rolloposarium as a full-blown theology factory. At first we thought it was a branch of the State University of Oregon, but before we got through reading it we didn't know but the University was a branch of ministerial kindergarten which is advertised on the title-page as "Adjacent to the University Campus on the West." In printing their catalog a stranger could not tell whether it was booming the University or the Divinity school as a side issue or the main thing. For instance on page 6 we read: "The University Department of Greek under Professor John Straub is so complete and thorough, including New Testament Greek, that it meets all our requirements in the Divinity Course. The same may be said of all of the departments with which we have associated our course of study." With Straub as a leading card of the Divinity school "adjacent to the campus," they advertise other members of the University faculty as members of the faculty of the Divinity school. "F. L. Wash-

burn, Professor of Biology, University of Oregon," takes a full hand in turning out graduates in divinity. It is not known how much he draws down for his share of profits in the theological plant, but it isn't likely his zeal for religion impels him to knock off anything on his \$3000 a year at the state institution. "B. J. Hawthorne, Professor of Psychology, University of Oregon," is advertised as a main spoke in the wheels of the Divinity school at Eugene. If his instruction in metaphysical science is on as materialistic a basis as Washburn's, some of the divinity students will be a little mixed in their exegesis of scripture. Washburn has printed a pamphlet on a five-toed frog that is almost open to a charge of heresy, and on a theological trial would condemn the author to a land where they have less ice in the winter time than in Oregon. The pamphlet gets the Divinity school and the State University as closely mixed up two-in-a-bed as dare be, and concludes with a form of bequest that one can hardly read whether it intends you shall leave your property to one or the other. Of course, the state has no right to be in any kind of a silent partnership with any denomination, whether it be Campbellite, Mormon, Catholic or Christian Science. It is not known just how much of their time the Professors of the State University who are the faculty of the Divinity school give to educating ministers. It is presumed they would give just as much to any other denomination that would set up a theological institute adjacent to the campus. We look for Father Przytycki to start a rival institution to the Mt. Angel theological seminary on the other edge of the campus, and then the other half of the faculty can put in their spare time graduating Benedictines. It might be better for the whole faculty to give all its time to religious education, but we fear the Liberals at Silverton would get out an injunction. The code of Oregon of 1872 declared that "members of every religious denomination and of no religious denomination shall be equally eligible to all offices and appointments." This was repealed in the session laws of 1876 and section 11 of the University act says: "No political or sectarian test shall ever be allowed or applied in the appointment of regents, professors, teachers or employees of the University." In making up Hill's code of Oregon, sections 10 and 12 of this act are printed but section 11 containing the above seems to have been omitted. The printer or compiler may have been drunk or may have had the establishment of a Divinity school in connection with the State University in mind. As the regents have recently cancelled a contract to erect an evangelizing equipment on the campus, their attention is invited to the members of their faculty employed adjacent to the campus.
