**SALEM LAWYERS NOTICE**  
 A Fair Statement of a Business Nature to Attorneys and Litigants

Statement—Contrary to certain interested reports, there is no trust of Marion county newspapers to charge outlandish prices for legal advertisements. Some of the newspapers have agreed to charge \$2 an inch for such notices, which is their business rate. In southern and eastern Oregon, four to six and seven dollars are charged for such advertisements. And even there the newspaper people do not become millionaires, and the rich estates and corporations paying for the notices are not driven to the wall. No one who respects honest pay for honest work has a right to complain at the low rates charged in Marion county. The Statesman cannot afford to charge lower rates for legal notices than it receives from business men and others using its columns; neither can any respectable newspaper; and, fortunately, most of the Marion county newspaper publishers are respectable and anxious to do the square thing.

**MISSOURI REFORM SCHOOL**  
 The false idea prevails that state departments and all state institutions must have large appropriations to exist, when as a matter of fact most state offices and state institutions could and should be made self-sustaining. Read this about the Missouri State Reform School:  
 "We are doing pretty well with our Reform School at Booneville," remarked Supt. J. D. Drake to a Globe-Democrat reporter the other day. "If the Missouri Commissioners will do the right thing by us we will have a big exhibit at a department of the Missouri display at the fair. At the Paris exposition we captured a medal in the competition, and I will say that I think we had some pretty exhibits there of the handiwork of our boys."  
 "How many boys have we? Well I guess about four hundred at the present time. Since the school was established we have only cost the state about one hundred and fifty thousand dollars. We have buildings at Booneville that are valued at two hundred and fifty thousand dollars. We built them ourselves. We made every brick and laid them. I am proud of the achievements of our boys. There is not an occupation that we do not teach our charges. They are taught seventeen different branches of trade."  
 "The school is practically a small town of itself. We have seventeen buildings, and all we asked of the legislature last year was an appropriation of \$4,000

for an ice plant. We have all we desire at present, and I cannot see why we should not continue to do as much good in reforming the young boys in the future as we have in the past. We have boys ranging from 8 to 17, and we teach all of them an occupation. Why, we can even teach them to make shoes, and they make all we use in the institution."
