THE SHAM BATTLE IN OHIO.

The student of practical politics must have been amused the past week at the sham battle between Hanna and Foraker for control of the Ohio legislature. It was simply a fight to keep out all other contestants.

Hanna and Foraker represent the same thing in public life—corruption, extravagance, and the hands of the Ohio legislature. Neither stands for a single principle of reform or progress. They represent an unprogressive back-number state.

They will baffle the legislature, strengthen the syndicates, promote jobs, create new offices, lead the people with more state taxes and institutions for the poor and favorites of the two great spoilsmen.

Hanna and Foraker are liable to dominate Roosevelt. They will stand together to control the young Republican Hercules in the White House if they can.

But they belong to the past. They are of a generation that had been rapidly forgotten. They will play into the hands of the trusts and strengthen the hands of socialism and anarchy.

Roosevelt naturally belongs to a younger and better generation of Republicans. He would be doing something to put things to rights, but he is staggering under an awful load of medieval statesmanship that lives for plunder and plunder only, that has not a redeeming feature of reform or progress.

In the Ohio Republican caucus for the organization of the General Assembly, the Hanna men secured control of the House and the Foraker men of the Senate.

Cole, in presenting the name of W. S. McKinnon, of Ashland, for speaker, denied that McKinnon's election could be construed as a humiliation of Senator Foraker, whose re-election they all desired. McKinnon was nominated over Price on the first ballot by a vote of 38 to 30.

After McKinnon's address of acceptance, Price was called out and made the sensational speech of the day by nominating and declaring himself for Hanna for re-election to the Senate two years hence.

A. G. Comings, of Oberlin, one of the Hanna leaders, was nominated without opposition for speaker pro tem. Burgess L. McElroy was nominated for re-election as Chief Clerk of the House over H. V. Spielman on the first ballot by a vote of 43 to 25. The Foraker Representatives made their last hard stand for Spielman. The other nominations were made without opposition.

In the Republican Senate caucus most of the time was devoted to the selection of a committee to apportion the standing committee. F. B. Archer, the Foraker candidate, was nominated for President pro tem, without opposition. The result of the Republican nominations affects the prestige of the Ohio Senators with the National Administration and with the future national and state campaigns, the re-apportionment of the Congressional districts.

The Joint Republican caucus will be held next week. As there is no opposition to the nomination of Senator Foraker for re-election, it will be merely a formal affair.

The organization means that Foraker and Hanna are both to be imposed on the country for another term apiece. It is doubtful if the country will survive the imposition.

Of the two men Hanna is the least dangerous. Foraker is far more frothy, Hanna wants the country to understand that he is in favor of doing something to harmonize labor and capital. As a great captain of industry he is in a position to render the country some service in this line. But will he do it? Time alone can tell.

THE TRUTH ABOUT THE GRAIN FLEET.

The Portland papers make altogether too much of the great grain fleet that loads and carries away millions of bushels of wheat from that harbor.

It is due to no enterprise on the part of the city of Portland. In fact the crimping process permitted in that city makes the port a terror to shipmasters from all over the world.

It simply means that cheap wheat must be furnished for all time to come by our farmers, and that the milling industry shall be sacrificed to the same industry in other countries.

It is a notorious fact that the rates made by the railroads on wheat to shipping ports is outrageously low and rates on flour is almost prohibitive, and that the milling industry on the Atlantic coast is being destroyed.

Instead of being able to mill the wheat in this country and employ labor in that industry the discrimination in favor of wheat is so destructive that it is driving more and more wheat abroad to be milled.

The grain fleet of Portland is growing, but it is evidence of discrimination increasing against the milling industry, and forecasts the decline of that industry on this coast just as it has gone down on the Atlantic.

THE BATTLE FOR SALARY REFORM.

Tuesday The Journal will present more details of figures from the records to show the imperative necessity of putting all state officials on a salary and covering all fees into the treasury.

Perquisites and emoluments other than a specific salary fixed by law are so clearly unconstitutional that no one will argue the matter for a moment.

Yet look at the spectacle of an ex-state officer suing to collect interest on state funds loaned to a husted bank, when the law specifically forbids such a practice.

Who doubts the courts will finally give him that interest? Look at what a demoralization of justice and of public sentiment that implies? The conscience of the uncorrupted people revolts at the situation.

If over \$8000 interest is due him as perquisites of the treasurer's office from that little bank, how much would he have been getting on all the title funds that were at his disposal?

The system is wrong and immoral that tempt officials with such opportunities. The system should be changed until there is not one penny of fees, perquisites or emoluments left to any official.

The extravagance of the last legislature resulting in a quarter of a million of increased state taxes is a serious matter. Conservative Republicans realize that it is not a proud record with which to go before the people.

The moral proposition involved in placing the salary system into effect, and saving at least \$10,000 a year to the taxpayers, or \$200,000 in the next four years, is worthy the support of the best men in all parties.

The last legislature was a body without moral purpose, business policy or political sagacity. It was animated by mob instincts with a vague determination to fight an alleged injury done an individual.

So far as the influence of a moral proposition can go to animate a law-making body with higher aims, the state salary reform ought to exercise a good effect on the next legislature.

It ought to secure to the people the service of men who can go up against an abuse involving \$50,000 in cash and not be easily removed from the field of battle or rendered inactive.

FRAUDS THROUGH THE POST-OFFICE.

THE JOURNAL is offered an ad with cash for publishing same in which one "Saul, Drawer H. Chicago, Ill." represents himself as of age and possessed of fortune of \$100,000 in coal mines, and wants a husband to put in charge of the property and incidentally of herself. The money and ad. are returned but we see that it is being run in other papers and will no doubt be the means of relieving a great many fools of their money in large or small sums. There are hundreds of these schemes and there is probably no way to keep the public from being swindled, as the right to publish and to circulate matter through the mails allows such games to be worked. But newspapers have no moral right to publish and the government has no right legally to become the means of spreading open palpable frauds through the newspapers and mails. The whole page ad. of the United States Steel Co. offering 12 percent dividends on stock is just as great a deception. People who send money to that capitalistic concern that it represented to be worth millions and have a new process of making "Jupiter Steel" will be as badly victimized as those who answer "Saul." All the capital in the world is ready to go into bonafide investments at six percent if it is a genuine proposition. This paper wishes to make money by advertising but it will not help poor people with schemes that are no better than a lottery, or straight-out swindles. Gambling is respectable compared to some of these pitfalls conducted in the columns of the newspapers and through the mails. There are a swarm of newspapers published under the name of literary monthlies, household friend, etc., that are filled with these swindling ads, and should be excluded from the mails.

What thoughtfulness for the manager of a far heel state exposition with a midway attached to set aside a day called Oregon day and ask its observance in this state! There are probably three persons from Oregon at the Fair-Midway and they are on a salary to eat up the \$5000 appropriated for an exhibit to a state which has no surplus population to send to Oregon but Crackers and colored people, who will never come. The force of the force will be seen when Oregon asks for an appropriation from all the states we have been shelling out for. Not one of them will give us a cent for the Lewis and Clarke centennial, which is an event of really national and historical importance. Sure we ought to fly the flag and close all business in the state for a day to celebrate the Tar-heel Midway.
