Office for Marion County Has Been Made Vacant.

Condit, and L. K. Adams. Although the remuneration for the place is not large, being entirely in fees received, and averaging about \$600 per year, the Marion county attorneyship is really the best in the state, as more loans are made in this county. At the present time these loans amount to \$216,000.

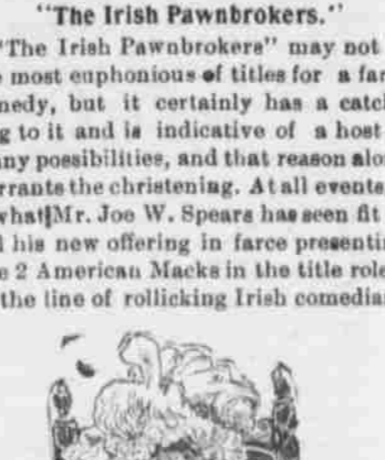
