STOCKTON'S

CONTRACT VIOLATED

Action Taken in the Case of the State Fair Board vs Denham.

F. P. Talkington, and J. C. Goodale, who were sureties for R. T. Denham, contractor of the State fair ground buildings, have filed their answer to the complaint made against them by the State Board of agriculture. The complaint alleges that R. T. Denham failed to complete his contract to complete and repair several buildings at the fair grounds, thereby damaging the board in the sum of \$400. Other sums were expended in completing the buildings, etc., and the judgment is asked for \$1135.21, with interest from Sept. 15, 1901.

These allegations are denied by the defendants, who hold that the contract was violated by the plaintiffs, in that they paid Denham in full for his services before the time stipulated in the contract, without the knowledge of the sureties, and in consequence they should be released from any liability in the matter. J. C. McNary, Brown and Wrightman are attorneys for the defendants, Carson and Adams for the plaintiffs.

Prince Victor To Visit Us

New York Jan. 10.—Prince Victor of Savoy leaves Rome, Italy, next week for a trip to the United States, according to a dispatch from Rome to the Journal and American. The Prince is fourth in line of succession to the throne of Italy.

He is one of the most accomplished cavalry officers in the Italian army and will be remembered also as having wounded Prince Henri of Orleans in a duel in Paris, the duel being brought about through insults to Italian prisoners in Abyssinia in the columns of the Paris Figaro.

Prince Victor visited the United States in 1897. It was rumored throughout Italy that he was sent to America to break off an unfortunate attachment. The uncle, King Humbert, however, is believed to have sent him to learn as much as he could of the institutions of America, especially the military establishments, as Prince Victor is destined for a military career.

It is generally believed in Rome, however, that Prince Victor returns to carry out the duty of his royal cousin, now King of Italy, has been given to a marriage with an American heiress.

CRISIS SAFELY PASSED

BERLIN, Jan. 11.—The German Venezuelan crisis is now regarded as practically over. The German warships Stein and Molke were today ordered to leave West Indian waters.

SALEM WOMAN'S DEATH

Caused by Explosion of a Steel Range.

Mrs. Brewer, formerly the wife of B. A. Witzel of Turner, died on Dec. 20, 1901, in Trinidad, Colorado, as the result of a terrible accident. Since last fall she has been living there with her daughter, Mrs. W. J. Bryan at 233 Walnut street. About 7:30 on the morning of Dec. 15, Mrs. Brewer was preparing cakes for breakfast at the steel range in the kitchen when it suddenly exploded and injured her severely. The explosion was caused by the freezing of the pipes leading from the stove to the hot water tank. The explosion knocked Mrs. Brewer to the floor with great force and she was struck in the face with several pieces of the stove, which tore her upper jaw entirely loose and penetrated almost to the base of the skull. The range was completely demolished by the force of the explosion, which also tore the doors in the room off of their hinges and broke windows in other parts of the house. Mrs. Bryan, who was dressing the children in an adjoining room, was nearly thrown to the floor.

The room was filled with smoke from the range, and Mrs. Brewer was carried out unconscious in a terrible condition. She was taken to a hospital, and died five days later from her injuries.

Mrs. Brewer spent the greater part of her life in the Willamette Valley, being a member of the Harburt family, at Albany.

PORTLAND THUGS GLOOMY

Wade and Dalton Breaking Fast.

Plans for the execution of Wade and Dalton still continue, although the actual construction of the gallows will not commence until within a few days of the date of the hanging, January 31.

There was unearthed yesterday a mechanism which was used in Multnomah County some years ago at an execution, to electric the trap. The trap was sprung by electricity, but the apparatus is clumsy and probably will not be used, as the opinion of Mr. Emery is that there might be a hitch. He is in favor of the simple mechanism which was used at the Green execution in Washington some weeks ago. An iron rod extended under the trap, and operated by means of a lever above, moving the rod so as to release the trap. It is as effective as the more complicated method and less liable to get out of order.

Wade seems less cheerful than he did a few days ago. The confinement is evidently telling on him, for he is less talkative and looks haggard and worried. At the present time, it is likely that Dalton will stand the strain better than his companion.

Neither man is now allowed to read the papers. Dalton is not allowed to read, as he never read them much, but Wade misses his reading of the daily news, and more particularly that concerning his crime or coming punishment. In a way, he has gloried in seeing his name mentioned. They are allowed all the books and magazines they want, but neither cares much for them. Dalton constantly reads the Bible and Wade spends much of his time in sleeping or taking a nap on his bunk.

Court of Arbitration

New York Jan. 11.—William H. Sayward, secretary of the National Association of Builders, makes the announcement that having submitted his plan of arbitration of building strikes to individual members of the building trades unions and employers organizations, he has now arranged to submit it to the organizations themselves. His plan contemplates a court of arbitration with paid officers, for the settlement of labor disputes.

AROUSE PUBLIC SPIRIT

Editorial Adopted from Baker City Paper.

Has Some Application But Salem Has a Commercial Club.

Have you studied the varying prosperity of communities according to the aggressive co-operative spirit shown? Such examples are everywhere. Co-operation in community affairs is cheap. It is not by any means a money proposition, although often in carrying out the plans of a progressive community, expenditures of small sums are involved, which fall very lightly if all the members of the community are enlisted in the cause.

If all the people are educated to a fine sense of public interest, things passed before without notice will quickly appeal to them. In the ordinary course of business, they will have a mind to public good, and regulate their conduct accordingly.

When this public spirit is rampant it is also much easier for all the constituents of a community to be kept in line for any effort necessary. When public opinion is aroused, individuals will not dare to brook it by holding out for some policy not regarded with favor.

There is no coercion possible except such as may be brought to bear by an offended people treating a retractory business man with disdain in business dealings. As this punishment is sufficient, as is often proven.

Combination of intelligence and energy is necessary. But where on the face of the western quarter of the globe is found more promising resources than here where there is an absence of public spirit quite galling to any one appreciative of the portents of the future?

Nature's pet has flourished for many years, but time always brings the day when Nature's favors are counterbalanced by the energy and pluck of man. If the full need of prosperity is to be enjoyed, public spirit must be stimulated. People must awaken to a study of what will benefit the community, which is often complex and requires careful consideration. If a spark of public life existed here, a stirring chamber of commerce would be organized, with plenary powers, and closely upon this preparatory work would follow support of a half dozen public enterprises hanging over the community with sable ominousness as defeat seems in store, or with resplendent brightness when consummation is promised.
