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JUNE ELECTION CAMPAIGN

Movements of Politicians in Oregon

Factional Fight in the Republican Party Spreads.

G. O. P. May be Divided in State as in Federal Affairs.

While a lot of the Salem politicians were carried to Portland out of a sense of religious duty, a number of Portland politicians used their free passes to spend the day in Salem.

Collector Patterson and Register Moore of the Land Office were rounding up their followers and in conference with their newspaper managers at the Capital city all day Sunday.

Collector Patterson and Ex-Sheriff Wrightman are mentioned as heading the anti-Geor push, with an active following of politicians who want to see a change.

Salem politicians who returned from Portland Sunday night report that the Williamson boom for congress is not taking on the magnificent proportions of an avalanche. Moody may yet get away with the nomination.

Hon. C. W. Fulton is making an aggressive canvass for the senate to succeed Simon, and will follow the Mitchell tactics of having Democratic support in the legislature.

A tip comes to THE JOURNAL from one precinct in this county that has had the strongest Fulton workers, who are now said to be quietly for Harvey Scott for Senator.

There is no doubt in the minds of those who go to Portland for information that there is a combination between Mitchell, Fulton and Scott to retire Senator Simon.

There is already talk of a second Republican convention in Marion county. The Telegram correspondent at Salem hints at such a possibility.

The general impression among Republicans is that the Mitchell faction that ran things in the last legislature will seek to run the county and state conventions and get control of the state government.

Failure to do that in any county or in the state convention, they will form alliances with other parties and make a ticket to be run against the regular Republican ticket.

These split tickets will be called Citizens tickets and the cry of machine will be raised against the regulars. This will divide the Republican party of Oregon into two factions on state issues just as it is divided now on federal matters and the delegation in Washington is rendered almost a nullity.

SAVED MANY LIVES

Tramp Drove off Train Wrecker.

J. H. Maguire, a workingman compelled by circumstances to be a tramp, at the risk of his own life prevented the wrecking and possibly the robbery of the Southern Oregon Express at the Soto Switch a few miles below Vines on January 13th, says the Medford Enquirer.

He was sleeping under a pile of ties and about one o'clock was awakened by the sound of a hammer; upon investigation he was surprised to find a man tampering with the switch. Maguire demanded to know what he was doing at which the would be wrecker fled. Maguire found the lock had been broken and the switch thrown halfway open. He rushed up the track and flagged an extra freight and had the switch repaired thus averting a wreck that might have cost many people their lives.

Valentine Brauning Dead

The funeral will be held Wednesday at 2 p. m. at the German Reformed church at the corner of Marion and Capital streets, Rev. Moellhaupt conducting the services. Interment will be in the cemetery in South Salem.
