THE PRIVILEGES OF THE PEOPLE

In the United States Senate the other day Senator Mitchell of Oregon offered a resolution providing for the appointment of a Messenger for the committee on Coast Defenses.

Senator Platt of Connecticut opposed the resolution and showed that the senate clerks and messengers now cost more in the aggregate than the total annual salaries and mileage of all the senators.

Senator Platt of Connecticut seems to be afflicted with a little of the out-of-date New England parsimony which is inclined to regard public business in the same light as private affairs.

The gentleman from the Nutmeg State should know better than to intrude such parsimony when a western senator is simply extending the privileges of the people to hold lucrative positions.

The messenger for the noble senators may have nothing to do but buy a newspaper or fetch a glass of toddy, but the dignity of the senate can only be maintained by introducing errands and lackies on the national payroll.

POLITICS IN OREGON GETTING RED HOT Democratic and Republican Interpretations of the Naming of Johns For Governor.

Politics in Oregon, even this early in the game, are assuming a most interesting phase. The Democrats have little hope of obtaining any of the high offices in the state. The Republicans are so mixed in the internal strife of the party as to make the offices of United States senator, governor and congressman anybody's plum who will take his pole to the fight.

A careful canvass amongst the men of both parties in Baker City has brought out a number of theories applied to the latest development of affairs, the naming of C. A. Johns of Baker City as a candidate for governor. The line up as now given stands something like this:

Sol Hirsch, the big boss, with an idea that he may be a dark horse for United States senatorship.

W. J. Furnish, recently a Democrat, now Republican aspirant for the governorship.

Stephen A. Lowell, like Furnish, also a candidate from Umatilla county for the governorship on the ground of being the logical nominee of the party from a stalwart point of view.

H. W. Scott, candidate for United States senatorship against Simon, C. W. Fulton, the boss of Clatsop county, candidate for United States senatorship. Anything to beat Simon.

J. N. Williamson of Crook county, candidate for Congress against Moody. C. A. Johns, candidate for governor against Geer, Furnish and Lowell.

Leading Democrats here say that the secret of Charley Fulton's recent visit to Baker City has transpired in the announcement in the Oregonian that Mr. Johns would be made a candidate before the convention for governor. They claim that Fulton is apparently fighting for himself alone, and that he is opposed, on his quiet, on political grounds alone, to some of the other candidates for the office; that Furnish is pulling with the Simon crowd, and Williamson

is lining up with them against Fulton. Simon himself is opposed to Geer and the Lowell crowd are opposed to Simon. These wise Democrats predict that in this general mixup, Mr. Johns will easily carry off the nomination for governor by having a solid Baker delegation at his back. They state that Mr. Johns can carry the Baker delegation and that even the Democrats of the county, knowing full well that they have no show to secure the governorship for their party, are more than favorable to Mr. Johns as against all others in the field. Why should they not be? He is a fellow townsman, a pioneer in Eastern Oregon, and a representative lawyer and business man.

One of the Republican stories is that Mr. Johns' name has been used to break down Geer in the interest of Furnish, with the proviso that if Johns will deliver the Baker delegation to Furnish in the opening of the convention, and if with that aid Furnish finds he cannot make the race, then the Furnish forces are to be turned over to Johns, he being conceded that Furnish by himself is not strong enough to win the fight, but that he can win with the aid of the Baker delegation and that Mr. Johns is willing to sacrifice him in the hope of a preference at the hands of the party. It is stated that Furnish is owned by Hirsch; that Hirsch will put up money in largess to be handled by Mr. Hirsch in their joint campaign; that Hirsch owns Williamson; that Hirsch is fighting Simon and Geer; that Fulton is playing in with the Furnish-Hirsch-Williamson combine to further his own interests, having Mr. Hirsch's promise that Fulton shall have the first chance in the legislature for the United States Senate. It is hoped by this combination to not only break Lowell and Geer, defeat Moody with Williamson, which the party owes to Williamson for his with-

drawal of all claims to the state secretaryship, but that four years from now Furnish, having been governor of the state, can then enter the race and defeat John H. Mitchell for the United States Senate. Some wheels within wheels may go around and they may not go around.

When interviewed yesterday, Hon. C. A. Johns stated that he had not yet entered the race, but that if he decided to do so he would go in clear of all entanglements, alliances or trades of any description; that he would go in the fight to win for C. A. Johns regardless of all other considerations, and that if he can not enter on a clean campaign on his own merits he will have nothing whatever to do with it.
