Doctor Jeffries of Salem Dead

At 2:30 Wednesday Dr. W. D. Jeffries, a practicing physician in this city and vicinity for nearly forty years, died at his home on North Church street, in this city, after an illness of several years.

Deceased was born at Zanesville, Ohio, August 1, 1838, and came to Oregon in 1863, locating at Salem. Here he remained for one year, when he removed to Eola, where he lived on a farm and practiced his profession until 1885. In that year he again returned to Salem and has ever since resided here.

Dr. Jeffries was a public spirited citizen, a true friend and a good neighbor. He was a member of the Spring Valley Presbyterian church at Zena, a Free Mason of high degree serving his lodge as Worshipful Master three times.

In politics Dr. Jeffries was a Democrat, and he served in the lower house of the Oregon Legislature, from Polk county in 1886 and 1887. Under Governor Penney's administration he served as prison physician, and filled other positions with credit and honor.

Dr. Jeffries first wife, a daughter of Mayor Walker, of Spring Valley, died about four years ago. About two years ago he married again. He leaves a wife and one daughter, Miss Emily, aged about 18 years, to mourn his demise. Two other daughters died, one about six years ago and the other in 1900.

The funeral will take place from the Spring Valley church at Zena, Polk county, and interment will be had in the family lot at that place.

Bear Captured in Wallowa

A report comes from Wallowa county that ranchers there a few days ago succeeded in bagging and killing a tremendously large bear, which for five years has been slaughtering cattle on the ranches of that county. Chase after chase has been given Mr. Bruin, but without avail. Within the last five months his lordship killed cattle on one ranch at the rate of \$10 per day. The depredations became unendurable and last week a posse of ranchers was formed to hunt the marauder, who was found high up in the mountains, and his scalp now hangs to the lodge pole of the ranch where the most of his slaughtering work was committed.

COPPER RIVER MINES BONDED

Salem Men Who Have a Share in a Million.

J. L. Sweeney arrived in Salem Wednesday afternoon from New York City where he was successful in bonding some Alaskan mining property in which he is interested. Mr. Sweeney is one of the great multitude of gold seekers who rushed to Alaska during the recent gold excitement, that has made an independent fortune. In the spring of 1898, Mr. Sweeney resigned his position at the state insane asylum at Salem, where he had been employed for many years, and in company with D. S. Kain, also of Salem, left for the Alaskan gold fields.

Together with other prospectors, who came principally from Minnesota and California, these Salem men bonded their interests and located upon claims in the Copper River country, at the head of the Chitena river. Subsequent prospecting disclosed that the property that had been located by the eleven, was remarkably rich in copper deposits. All purchase offers were rejected and the owners of the property came out from Alaska last fall. Mr. Sweeney was chosen to go to New York City in the interest of those interested in the property. While in New York Mr. Sweeney succeeded in bonding the property to a New York concern for \$1,000,000. This is divided equally among the eleven parties interested.
