## EDITORIAL

### ADVERTISING THE CAPITAL CITY

The double illustrated Saturday Journal, is being used by some of our real estate dealers to send to eastern people to show the life and activities of this community.

Is there a better way of showing to the world the growth and material and moral advancement of this city than by such a daily paper? We believe it is the best kind of advertising matter.

A number of the Saturday Journals went to a group of farmers in Cass county, Iowa, and will certainly bring some of them here to live.

The well-to-do farmers of the east are getting alive to the fact that it is a great advantage, laying aside a better climate, when they can locate at or near a large growing city, where there are superior educational and business advantages for their children.

If our people who get letters from their eastern friends, asking questions about our country and climate and products and opportunities, will hand us such letters, they will be answered in print and a paper sent of the Saturday issue.

There is a point of contact made through the columns of a live daily newspaper that is effective and enduring. People in the east show such papers to their neighbors and some subscribe.

Another thing; such a double illustrated paper is evidence of life and prosperity and business. People are going where there is business. Live merchants make a live town. A live town increases the value of property and business.

### PUBLIC SCHOOLS MAKE BUSINESS.

The street car lines did more business Friday evening on the occasion of the public school graduating exercises than on any other occasion this winter.

Over a thousand people turned out to hear those exercises which were very creditable to the teachers and pupils. The audience was made up of people from every walk of life.

What is true of the car lines doing increased business on account of the public schools would be found true of every line of business in the city. The schools are democratic and lift and energize the whole.

As far as they go the Salem public schools are as good as any in the state. But the facts remain that with a higher school tax than most cities, Salem public schools do not teach as many grades as other cities.

THE JOURNAL believes that with a more progressive and better adjusted system fifty percent more children could be in the public schools and not levy any more taxes. It would help the city and all other schools.

We are not going to point out the remedy but we are asking the people to consider the bare fact stated above. The next school election is June 16, when a director and clerk are to be elected.

### PORTLAND'S POLITICAL INFLUENCE

If it's a fair question, what is it? Is it good, wholesome, elevating, beneficial upon the state?

The expenses of their county government has increased \$50,000 the past year. Everything is fought out over faction, over personality, on the lines of spoils politics.

Would not the Republicans of the state do better to adopt the clean, wholesome, businesslike program of Marion county?

Should the Portland Senatorial faction fight that debauches our legislators be extended to every department of our state administration?

Why not let Portland influences be confined to Portland until the people down there become more intelligent and capable of better things.

The people of Marion county and of the whole state outside of Portland want a better order of things to prevail than grows out of Portland's political methods.

Look at the trifling attitude of Portland newspapers toward public affairs. There is not an ear set serious thought for better government in the state at large grows out of Portland brain-workers.

The Portland politicians, even the Port of Portland commission, are permeated by a coarse consuming selfishness, egotism and smart-aleckism, that is distressing to the closer observer of the public pulse and bodes little good to this commonwealth.

### NOT AN INSPIRING SIGHT.

Mr. O. Frank Paxton was the inspiring genius who presided over the conference of the State Republican Central Committee at Portland Saturday.

Who is Paxton? He was for years attorney for the robber textbook trust while acting as a representative of the people and official of a state school.

He fastened upon the state a ten year light contract as attorney for the electric corporation when he was in the legislature.

He got a law passed under which school districts had to issue bonds for twenty years interest and principal payable in New York.

As Presidential elector he ran hundreds behind his ticket. Of course, the state control committee under his steering could not think of doing anything to promote state salary reform and business administration. But the whole party is not composed of persons whose education is so radically bad as Mr. Paxton's.

### HORRIBLE TO THINK OF.

What would be the effect of one Oregon business legislature with a man like Papiriwald, Burrows or Walker of the Salem City Council for Chairman of the Ways and Means Committee?

If the State Government would get right down to the Marion county business program and reduce state taxes three mills next year, could the people ever stand it?

One man like Billy Hall in the court house who refuses to expedite grafts, is worth four times his salary to the people. Such men should be sent to the legislature.

Men like Wehring and Settlemier who have pulled the State Board of Agriculture out of the mire of push politics and made it really a state fair, would be worth sending to the state senate.

But we don't send men to the legislature to transact business for the people, but to elect officers for themselves and their relatives, and elect some politician to the United States Senate.
