time of the club's existence it has resulted in the location of a number of important industries and a general and most satisfactory quickening of the spirit of civic pride and enterprise.

### Locating Industries.

During the past four months the Greater Salem Commercial club and citizens working in connection therewith have added to the manufacturing industries of Salem the Lively sawmills, and the Flax Fibre Industry operated by Mr. Eugene Basse of Green Bay, Wis.

Of the first it is sufficient to say that the firm in an established one of many years standing in good financial condition and that its quota added to the other institutions of the kind already here can not fail to be materially beneficial.

But it is the securing of the second, the flax fibre industry, of which the town has reason to be both proud and hopeful. 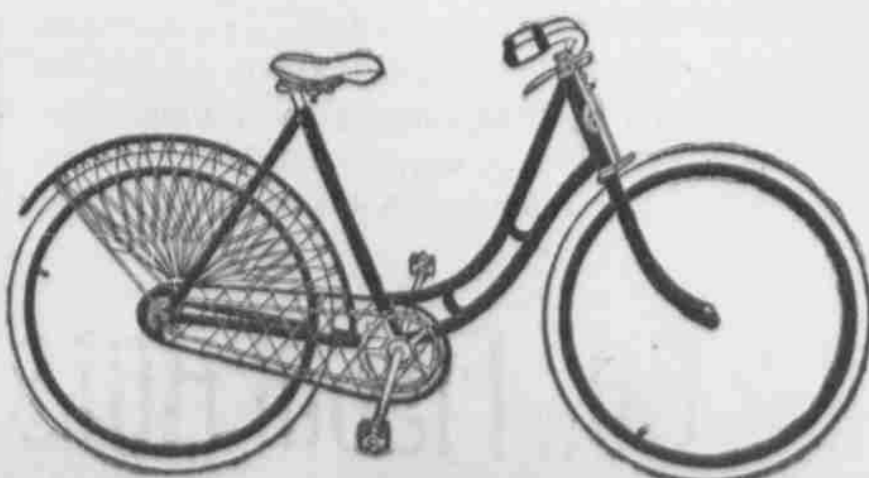

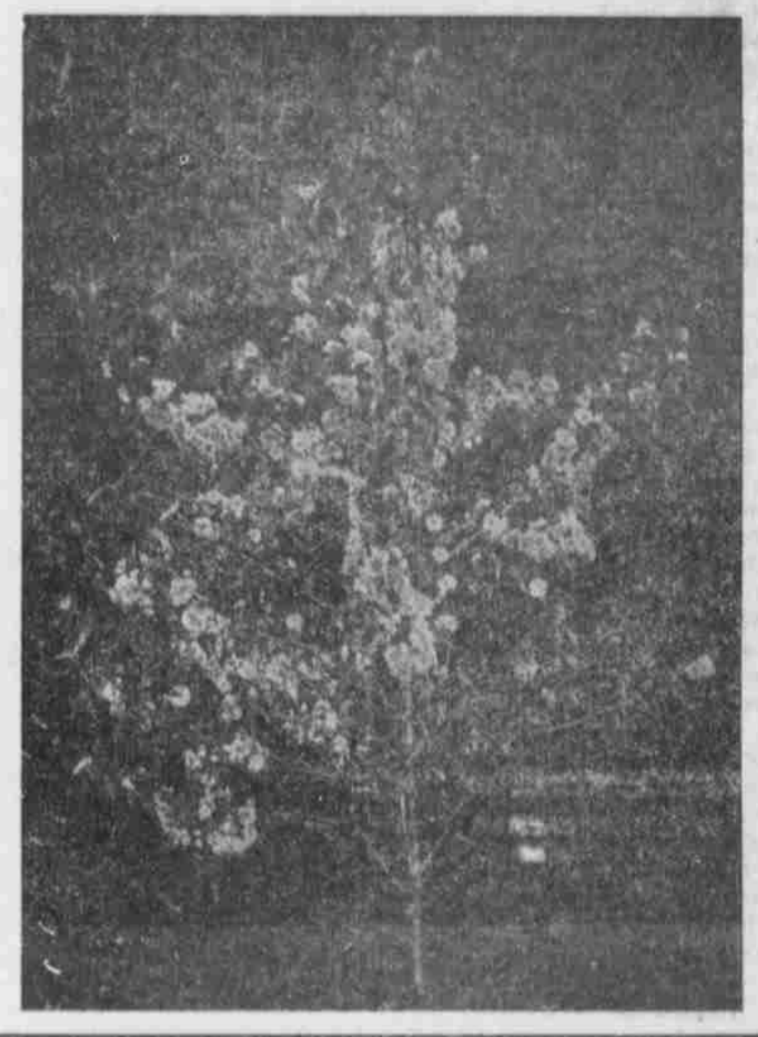

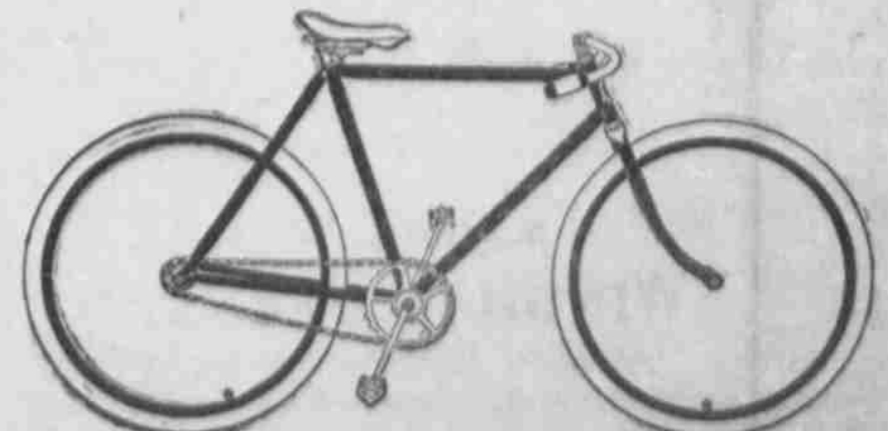
