EDITORIAL

TREAT THE YOUNG MAN FAIRLY.

A correspondent of a Salem Republican paper discussing the probable nomination for the office of Attorney-General, has a very unfair way of discussing F. T. Wrightman, of this city. Mr. Wrightman is a candidate for that nomination, and has a perfect right to be. He made his fight open and above board, and has a good chance to get the honor of being on the ticket. The paper referred to says:

"Another office is attracting some attention at this time is that of Attorney-General. Lina county is expected to ask for the renomination of the present incumbent, Hon. D. R. N. Blackburn, and that gentleman hopes to also come in with a number of other strong delegations supporting him. The Marion county candidate, Frank T. Wrightman, is apparently out of the race, since the Republicans of this county gave him the awful trouncing at last Friday's primaries, but his supporters here still hope for a favorable turn that will land him in the place."

As Governor Geer said when his friends called on him at his \$15-a-month home, the primaries settled the differences between Republicans, and so far as aspiring to office at least they are all on an equal footing. The "awful trouncing" given F. T. Wrightman at the primaries is what makes him a marked man for that nomination if the opposition to Governor Geer are in control of the state convention.

It should be remembered that the fight on Governor Geer is entirely from within the Republican party. That fight is not confined to Marion County, but includes prominent Republican politicians in other parts of the state, who, for personal and factional reasons, are determined not to give Governor Geer a second term.

As an independent paper the Journal has been a friend and well wisher of the Geer administration, and has not hesitated to fully express itself when it thought it could do so without injuring that gentleman's chances of success. But the Journal cannot assume to pass on the relative merits of Republican aspirants or factions. The Republican party is larger than any aspirant or faction, and is still more likely to remain the dominant force in control of the government of the state, unless such bad work is done that the state will be turned over to the Democrats.

The Journal does not think the fight on F. T. Wrightman is justifiable, or should be kept up, any more than it thinks the Republican fight on Governor Geer is in the true interest of the party. But these are matters that cannot be helped, and should not be heeded by thinking men. Mr. Wrightman was twice county chairman and rolled up great majorities for his party, and pulled it through hard places. He is a young man who stepped out of the shadow of his father, and has gained for himself a prominent position in the legal profession and in public affairs. He has a right to be a candidate for Attorney-General, and would be a credit to the ticket and the state if elected. His crime of being a young man is shared by a great many, and his following among the young men is second to none in Marion county. The Journal is in no way losing faith in Governor Geer, and the work he has done, but it does not think that it is in the interest of Marion county to refuse even such a position as chief legal officer of the state, if it cannot get the executive office.

The Polk county Republican convention singled out the state printer to be put on a salary. That's on a par with the theory that Monmouth alone should have a normal school appropriation.

GOOD MATERIAL FOR LEGISLATORS.

The name of Jesse Settlemeier, of Woodburn, for representative, is attracting much favorable comment among the Republicans. As a member of the state fair board he stood for good business management, and against grafts in general.

He is a man no one will always agree with, and a man who is very set in his ways, once he has made up his mind what is the right thing to do. He is quite stubborn, in fact, and hard to manage at times.

But the opposition type comes high as legislator. The prostitute style of position says yes, to everybody. He is in with everybody, and cannot say no, to any proposition. This is not Settlemeier.

Hence Settlemeier is not so popular as some others. But he could be elected, and would make a safe man for Marion county in the legislature, as he has on the state fair board.

The test of a pudding is eating of it. The people have had a sample of Mr. Settlemeier in public business. They like the sample, and want more of the goods. But the market is not overstocked, and always easy to get. If Mr. Settlemeier is nominated in the Republican county convention, it will not be done by the politicians.

THE SOCIALIST SALARY PLANK.

The state Socialist platform declares that no state official should receive over two thousand dollars a year.

That is a mistake so far as the figures are concerned, because it excludes all but rich men from the state offices.

The governor, treasurer and secretary of state are important offices, and require the best men of ability and high character.

It is doubtful if they could be secured for \$2,000 a year under present conditions for the services they render the people.

In the opinion of the writer the result would be better to give those three officers a flat salary of \$5,000 a year, than \$2,000.

It would be cheaper to the people, and better in the long run. But that may not be the proper figure, in the judgment of the legislature.

The Socialist figure is not an arbitrary declaration, but more a demand for a fixed salary, and is right in principle, but is too radical.

Under all the circumstances a \$2,000 salary would work a social injustice, and favor the wealthy man as against the man of moderate means.

THE MARION COUNTY PROGRAM.

The Marion county Republicans owe a duty to the state in pointing out the way to a thorough reformation of our state government.

Marion county has been taken out of debt, her county tax reduced, her officers put on salaries, and all fees go into the treasury.

That simple rule laid down for our state government would work a change of half a million to the good in the state government.

The people demand such a declaration from the Republican delegates at the Marion county convention March 26th, and it should be given them.

The Multnomah county convention overlooked the fact that there is urgent necessity for this reform, and they said not a word about it.

Multnomah county will come up and demand a million for the Lewis and Clark exposition, and, unless there is retrenchment somewhere, debt will be forced on the state in the form of a bond issue.

Marion county does not believe in extravagance or bonded debt. It believes in straight business—more business and less politics.

With the West filling up with people, the state tax burdens must be lightened as the means of drawing settlers to Oregon.

MITCHELL SUCCEEDS MORGAN.

In the great race of building the Nicaragua canal on paper, the Democrat, Morgan, has played the leading role. He delayed that measure for years in the interest of corporations.

Will Senator Mitchell, of Oregon, do any different? The only man who has ever had charge of the measure who has pushed it with nerve and vigor was old Peter Hupburn, of Iowa.

Mitchell's canal bills were stock-jobbing enterprises, to issue hundreds of millions of bonds, and get the government to guarantee them, in the interest of a private corporation.

Will Mitchell not serve his old stock-jobbing friends now, that he is in Morgan's place?

It remains to be seen how much further the corporation game of shuttlesack can be played with the canal.

That it will be played to a finish, and that Mitchell has never been a thorn in the side of the corporations are patent facts.

CHINESE EXCLUSION BILL.

The bill is thrown out by the Mitchell Chinese exclusion bill is doomed to defeat, as the railroad and steamship lines are opposed to the bill.

No one who keeps posted on the inside workings of this sort of legislation doubts for a moment that the great corporations will be cared for either way.

They employ coolies for section hands and in building track, and even bridges and culverts. The steamboats employ all they want to. The farmer cannot employ coolies to clear land.

Jesse Settlemeier, of Woodburn, has made a record for business management on the state fair board, that would make him a valuable man for representative or senator.

Billy Hall, the county clerk for the past four years, wishes it understood that he is not a candidate for senator, or any other office. But he is the kind of a man who is needed on the ticket, just the same.

Frank Wrightman stock is in the ascendancy, and his friends consider him as good as nominated. They say the delegation at Portland makes it impossible for Geer to succeed, and no other office can come to Marion county.
