PORTLAND CAR MEN PLEASED. Higher Wages and Shorter Hours In-

augurated.

PORTLAND, April 1 .- As a result of the annual meeting in San Francisco of the Portland Traction Company. which controls the Portland Railway Company's system in this city, the wages of the employes will be raised, a 10-hour day inaugurated, and extensive improvements will be made to the line, both in new work and rebuilding of old lines. The plan for improvements has been in contemplation by Mr. Fuller for some time, and now that it has been endoused, work will

begin immediately. Employes who have worked more than a year will receive 22% cents an hour, and those more recently in its employ, 20 cents an hour.. A 10-hour day will be made as general as possible. Heretofore 20 cents an hour has been paid to senior employes and 171/2 cents to new men, and the worknig day has been 12 hours.
