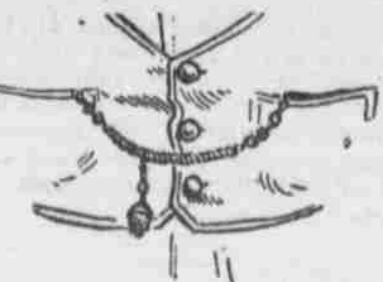

CANAL BILL TO BE SHELVED

Senate Will Delay its Consideration

May Go Over Till the Next Session.

Other News of the National Capital.

WASHINGTON, April 4.—A meeting of the Senate steering committee will be held in a few days to decide upon a course of legislation after the disposition of the Chinese exclusion bill.

Commissioner of Pensions. WASHINGTON, April 4.—It is given out here, in rather a convincing way, that Dr. T. L. Flood, of Erie, Pa., will be appointed commissioner of pensions.

Immigration Commission. WASHINGTON, April 4.—It is reported this morning that Frank Sargent, chief of the Brotherhood of Locomotive Firemen, has accepted the place of United States commissioner of general immigration.

Chinese Exclusion Up. WASHINGTON, April 4.—The House, in committee of the whole, today began the consideration of the Chinese exclusion bill.

Kahn, of California, made the first important address on the measure. He discussed at length the desirability of the Chinese as residents of this country. He contended that as a race they were known for their duplicity, which characteristic had rendered necessary the tightening of the loophole whereby the Chinese have been evading the exclusion law.

BRITISH FORCE ROUTS DELAREY

Heavy Fighting At Close Quarters—Casualties On Both Sides Are Severe.

LONDON, April 4.—Lord Kitchener today reports a heavy engagement near Dreikull, Western Transvaal, on March 31st, in which fifteen hundred Boers, under Delarey and Kemp, were completely routed by a British force under Generals Cookson and Kler.

LONDON, April 4.—The Daily Chronicle this morning says that Lord Milner, the British High Commissioner in South Africa, has requested a credit of £3,000,000 for new railways and railway extensions and connections in South Africa.

Small Chance of Peace. Pretoria, April 4.—Communications have passed between President Steyn and the Transvaal mission at Kroonstad, but nothing is yet known of the result. The majority of the military men and civilians expect more from the continued presence of the troops than from the present negotiations.

Breach of Neutrality Charged. WASHINGTON, April 5.—The cabinet today considered the allegations of the governor of Louisiana that Port Chalmers, La., is being used as a military depot by the British.

Judge Hard On Strikers

INDIANAPOLIS, Ind., April 4.—The Redwood Manufacturing Company has appealed to the United States court for protection for its employees against the iron molders, who have been on strike for a month past.

Judge Baker ordered the strikers, whose names were given in the complaint to appear before him April 15, and show cause why a restraining order should not be issued.

"I want you to change your bill of complaint," Judge Baker said to the plaintiff. "I want you to include in it a prayer for damages. It does not matter whether these men have any property or not. I will appoint a special master to fix the damages, and if you secure judgment against the strikers, officers can, if the men are caught in bed, take away their clothing. They can have no property exempt under the state laws. The judgment will keep them in insolvency as long as they live, or until the judgment is paid. Things have come to a pretty pass when the city of Indianapolis will not give the men who want to work protection from men who do not want to work."

Can Shut Out Marconi. BERLIN, April 4.—The Lokal An-

zeiger says that under the existing statute the government can prevent the use of the Marconi wireless telegraph system on German merchantmen, the erection of stations on the coast of Germany, or the use of the system in German waters. The paper suggests that the government apply the law immediately.

DUG UP BOX OF TREASURE.

Men Excavating Unearth Box Containing \$3,000 in Gold.

ROCK FALLS, Ill., April 4.—While men were excavating in the Heunepin canal feeder, near Tampico, Ill., they discovered a queer looking box. The box, which was very heavy, was taken from the feeder and opened, and it was discovered to contain gold coin to the amount of \$3,000, and large amount of brass pieces. As near as could be ascertained it thought that the coin is Spanish. Last summer a number of human skulls were found in the canal near Tampico, and a treasure box containing about \$5,000 in Spanish coins.
