## Desire a Street Carnival

As a departure from the usual stereotyped program for an Independence Day celebration, a number of Salem citizens are advocating a street carnival as an innovation and a decidedly attractive feature for the celebration planned for Salem on July Fourth. Advocates of the street carnival argue that such an attraction would not cost more than the aggregate of the sums that would be devoted to other forms of entertainment, and claim that the carnival would be sufficient in itself for the day's program, that could be nicely concluded with a pyrotechnic display from the river front. A great many citizens are enthusiastically in favor of such a carnival, and the subject will receive the consideration of the general entertainment committee at the proper time. The initial and essential work that devolves upon the Fourth of July committee, is the raising of the funds necessary for a celebration, and when that has been accomplished it will be an easy task to provide for a demonstration, both entertaining and patriotic.

## WAR WOULD ENSUE

Should Americans Leave the Philippines.

WASHINGTON, April 30.—General MacArthur today concluded his testimony before the Senate Philippines committee. He said that if the United States forces were withdrawn from the islands, fratricidal war would result that could only be suppressed by exterior forces. The Filipinos, he declared, were absolutely unfit for self-government at present, but that they might some day, under proper influences and instruction, be able to care for their own affairs. Senator Patterson's questions angered the general, and on several occasions he declared that he would think and believe what he pleased, granting the senator the same right.

## BADLY BEATEN BY THUGS

Portland Slum Worker Victim of Assault.

PORTLAND, Or., April 30.—From the effects of a terrible beating received at the hands of five thugs, near First and Everett streets, Miss Faith Stewart, a woman missionary, who has labored to rescue fallen girls, lies at a community home, 330 East Sixth street, dangerously hurt. She believes in the principles of divine healing, according to her co-workers, and on that account refuses to have a physician called or medicine administered. The dastardly assault took place Sunday night, about 10:30 o'clock, but the facts were suppressed by the police, and only leaked out yesterday from information supplied by Miss Stewart's friends. The injured woman was struck and choked by the ruffians, but she will probably recover should she consent to receive medical aid.

## Treasure Mine A Wonder

EUGENE, Or., April 30.—The richest strike ever made in the Blue River mining district has been found in the Treasure mine, owned by C. H. Park. Assays of samples taken promiscuously give more than \$2000 to the ton. The ledge is 18 to 25 feet wide.

## PLUCKY YOUNG ENGLISHMAN

Prodigal Son Taken Ill Many Miles From Home.

A plucky young Englishman giving the name of Pepper is receiving treatment at the Salem Hospital for typhoid fever. Pepper claims to have arrived in America about a month ago from Yorkshire, England, having worked his way across the ocean and also to the Pacific coast. About two weeks ago he applied to County Judge Scott for work, but the county could give him no employment. Pepper seemed real anxious to do work of some kind, and expressed a desire to do farm work, if he could not find anything else, being determined to work at something. He was directed to Silverton, where he found employment on a farm, only to be taken down with a fever, when the attention of the county officials was called, and he was removed to the hospital. Questioned concerning his home and his parents, Pepper showed great reticence, and Judge Scott thinks the lad, who is only 16 years of age, ran away from home. The boy finally informed the hospital management that his father, George Pepper, was a captain in charge of a vessel, and that his address was Yorkshire, England. County Judge Scott has written the boy's parents, notifying them of their prodigal son, and of his condition, which is not serious. Young Pepper says his parents are comfortably situated, and are able to provide for him.

## CORNER IN GOLD MINES.

TACOMA, Wash., April 30.—Samuel R. Balkwill has effected a consolidation of the numerous producing gold mines of Washington, Oregon, California and Idaho, and is incorporating the consolidated companies with a capital of \$15,000,000.
