Frazier, secretary of the Democratic county central committee, received a letter on Tuesday from Mr. Chamberlain, written at Albany, requesting that the meeting at Salem, originally arranged for Tuesday, May 13th, be deferred until Saturday, May 17th, as he would find it inconvenient to be in Salem sooner. The hour for holding the meeting when Mr. Chamberlain does visit Salem has been decided upon for the afternoon.

Civic Improvement League
to Be Organized

A meeting of exceptional interest to Salem people will be held in the city hall armory Friday evening. It is the Civic Improvement League, and has for its purpose the devising of means for the improvement and beautifying of the city. Music will form a part of the program, the principal number of which will be an address by G. M. Hyland, of Portland, on the methods and results of civic improvements, as practiced throughout the East. Mr. Hyland may bring a stereopticon with him, and illustrate his lecture.

RALLY ON MAY SIXTEENTH

When Candidate Furnish and
Other Speakers are Coming

Chairman W. J. Culver, of the Marion county Republican central committee, has been advised that the candidates on the Republican state ticket will be in Salem on Friday evening, May 16th. The Republicans have begun arrangements for a grand rally on that occasion, in which the Salem Republican Club, the Young Men's and First Voters' Republican Club and the Salem Workingmen's Club will participate.

DIRECT NOMINATION AT WOODBURN

Speakers and Candidates to Appear There On Saturday
Evening May 17th at 7:30

The great direct nomination mass meeting at Woodburn will be held Saturday evening, May 17, at 7:30 p. m.

Mayor Tomlinson, J. H. Settlemier and Jacob Voorhees are the local committee in charge of the meeting, and the speakers are, as advertised, Gov.

The executive committees of the different clubs held a meeting Wednesday afternoon and took the initial steps for a big rally. Details of the program and the exercises will be announced in a few days. It is proposed to give the candidates a grand reception at Salem, and to that end several bands and glee clubs will be engaged, the city will be extensively decorated, and a monster street procession is being considered. By the time of the meeting, the younger Republicans will have organized their flambeau and cymbal clubs, and will be ready to participate in the demonstration.

The party will consist of W. J. Furbush, candidate for governor; A. M. Crawford, for attorney-general; J. H. Ackerman, for state superintendent, and C. W. Fulton, who will do the principal part of the talking. In receiving and entertaining the candidates, the three Salem Republican clubs will act in conjunction. The rally will be held in the city hall armory.

TROTTER HORSES SOLD

The public sale of trotting horses of J. H. Rhoten, of Turner, recently from Iowa, was held at Simpson's Court-street livery stable in this city Wednesday afternoon, May 7th. The sale was largely attended, and much interest shown, but the horses did not bring the values they should have brought. This was probably due to the fact that Oregon people are not educated up to the public sales of pedigreed horses, and a similar sale in the future would probably do better.

Hobbie and Poole, a lay driving team, was bid in by D. O. Woodworth, of Albany, for \$270. Judge Nation, a yearling stallion, went to O. E. Krausse, at \$205. Ruby Salisbury, a 2-year-old filly, was purchased by Mr. Westgate, of Albany, for \$212.50. Tilton Ford, of Salem, became the owner of Oregon's Pet, a bay filly foaled in 1897. The price paid was \$135.

Claud, the great standard bred mare, a full sister to Brown Dick, 2:12, and dam of Waukeek King, 2:21, was sold to Ed. Martin, of Turner, for only \$110. She was an aged mare, foaled in 1887.

Mr. Rhoten still keeps two fine brood mares for his own use, and has not entirely gone out of the horse raising business.

Salem Men Make a Strike

Mr. W. A. Gray, of Portland, president of the California Home Mining Co., of Oregon, in which Dr. Mark S. Skiff, T. W. Potter and A. S. Overman, of this city, were large owners, took the morning train for Bakersfield, California, in response to an offer of \$20,000 for a single claim of its property of which has samples. Mr. Gray has proceeded to the ground to make a personal inspection of the property before accepting the offer.

The company paid \$1000 for this claim about two months ago, and has spent \$2000 in development work, and were just ready to install a five-stamp mill on the property. Should the company decide to accept this offer they will still have sixteen claims in the same vicinity, which they consider just as good as the one proposed to be sold, and they will develop the remaining claims, and put up stamp mills.

The sale of this claim will pay the stockholders about a 60 per cent. dividend on their investment.

The claims still owned by the company are still worth many times the value of the claim sold.
