THE FOURTH WILL BE WARM

Salem Will Entertain the Whole Valley

Bands, Balloons, Parade, Sports, Floats, Flags and Autos

The Salem Silver Cornet band played some stirring airs, and drew a splendid attendance of the younger business men of this city.

The finance committee reported \$1505 subscribed, and \$1750 in sight. A telegram was read showing that Vancouver, Wash., had put \$476 to have a monster celebration. There is nothing so about Salem.

The balloon ascension is to be an explosive affair, with a parachute jump from a ring of fire.

There is to be a band of jubilee singers. The Trice sisters in a colored cakewalk.

The committee on day and night fireworks reported an elaborate line of explosives, to wind up with a \$250 figure piece.

The general committee and all the sub-committees met at the police court last night and settled it.

Salem will have the grandest celebration ever seen throughout the Northwest.

Independence day will see a crowd at Salem such as the oldest inhabitant has never seen before.

The Fourth of July falls on Friday this year. It will be a red and blazing day in the Capital City.

There will be about ten bands that will play from morning until late at night—all the bands that can be hired have been secured.

Japanese bombs will be exploded from a dray truck in the procession. The total amount of powder to be exploded is \$400.

The parade committee would like about 40 volunteer cavalry volunteers from the city, suburbs and nearby towns, a boys' clown band, and a float from the Woman's Club, if possible.

F. T. Wrightman has accepted and will serve as grand marshal.

The committee on floats made a very complimentary report, showing displays on a grand scale. Three lodges are preparing elegant emblematic designs, including one from a state institution, and one from the Indian school, showing the red man's progress from savagery to civilization.

The committee on decorations reported nearly every business house preparing to decorate lavishly. Each telegraph pole on the street is to fly flags.

The sports committee has \$100 up in prize; \$50 for a shooting match. Protection lodge No. 2 has a crack uniformed drill team that is going to Portland Saturday, and will parade in the early evening.

Outside Attractions \$250.

The balloon feature is to cost \$200 for two ascensions—one ascension to cost \$150 or \$200 for one day and one night.

At a certain elevation the balloon explodes, collapses and he drops 500 feet before his parachute opens. He also takes up a turkey and lets it fly. With torpedoes he makes a great white cloud, goes above it, and then drops through it.

The celebration is to be held at Marion square, and that place is to be made a tower of beauty. A gross of No. 10 size flags was ordered for the speakers' stand alone.

The committee on sports is planning to secure an automobile race on one of the principal streets.

The Albany, Silverton, Monmouth, Turner, Ocala, Chemawa, reform school and Salem bands will play all day and night, or as long as they can stand up.

There will be a continuous entertainment day and night. There will be something going on all the time.

The Infinite Cold of Space.

The balloons sent up by Prof. Assmann, under the auspices of the International Aeronaustic Commission at Berlin, showed a practical utility which seems to point to the true usefulness of what has been hitherto an unwieldy toy. These were small balloons filled with self-registering apparatus and sent up without passengers. On reaching the thin air of high altitudes they burst, after which they became parachutes and brought their instruments safely to the ground.

One of them reached a height of 20,000 meters, or more than twelve miles, and its thermometer registered eighty degrees Fahrenheit, below zero. As there were still many miles of air above the point reached, the figures registered give us some conception of what the scientists mean when they tell us about the infinite cold of space.
