DEGREES WERE CONFERRED
Concluding Program of Willamette's Commencement
Miss Mary M. Perciful Receives the Waller Prize
The concluding program of the 58th annual commencement of Willamette University was given at the University Thursday evening. It was the occasion of the commencement day proper, and the program included the conferring of degrees, unveiling of the Alvan F. Waller memorial tablet and the awarding of the Waller prize. Degrees were conferred as follows: College of Liberal Arts—Clarence A. House, A. B.; College of Law—Allen Forward, LL. B.; John Logan Norwood, LL. B.; Wm. Ellis Richardson, LL. B. Mr. Richardson received his undergraduate degree about three years ago. The degree of Doctor of Divinity was conferred upon Rev. Charles E. Gibson, and that of Doctor of Law upon Henry Clews, of New York City. Impressive services attended the unveiling of the Alvan F. Waller memorial tablet. The tablet is the gift of Miss Ellen J. Chamberlain, an alumna of 1868. It is a marble slab 22 inches long and 16 inches wide, and bears upon the surface in plain letters the following inscription: "In memoriam Alvan F. Waller, Born 1803, Died 1872. In the Master's name he gave our University the best years of his honorable and useful life. Alumnus." The inscription was suggested by President T. M. Gatch, of the State Agricultural College, at Corvallis, former president of Willamette University. The unveiling of the monument was preceded by a memorial address by Hon. C. B. Moores, in which he reviewed the life of the early Methodist pioneer missionary, and founder of Willamette University. M. I. Chamberlain paid a tribute to the memory of the University founder, and unveiled the tablet, which was accepted
