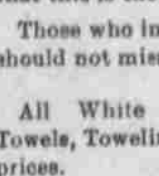

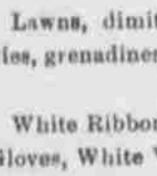

Church of God Congregation Erecting Church Home

Building Boom in Salem Continues at Good Pace

With the arrival of settled weather conditions, Salem's building boom has resumed with the same activity that was apparent earlier in the season.

Good progress is being made on the several down-town business blocks, and the usual amount of work in the residence district. Work is plentiful for all kinds of labor, and the only trouble that is experienced is in getting an adequate supply of building materials with which to carry on the operations.

The congregation of the Church of God has commenced the erection of a permanent house of worship on the grounds and adjoining the building that was formerly occupied by the Salem Hospital, on Twelfth street.

The building will be called a tabernacle, and its dimensions will be 40x80. It will be a frame structure, and cost about \$1000.
