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BYRD ELECTED DIRECTOR

Little Interest Taken in Monday's School Election

Dr. W. H. Byrd was elected director of the Salem school board Monday to succeed H. A. Johnson, retiring chairman of the board. Little interest was taken in the election, only 418 of the 1400 legally qualified electors of the district participating. Dr. Byrd's friends worked hard during the afternoon, and had several carriages employed. Mr. Tutill's friends, on the other hand, were not organized, and that gentleman and many of his personal friends did not even go to the polls.

Dr. Byrd was elected over Mr. Tutill by a vote of 260 to 158. The vote was as follows:
