**DON'T FALL IN READILY.**  
Marion county representatives and senators duck fast in easily with the Portland special session program, to include their fair job.

The special session to enact flat salaries and put the direct legislation amendment into effect is a Marion county idea, and stands upon its merits.

It has been approved by a decisive vote of the people. It was in all platforms, promised by all parties. A resolution for the Lewis and Clark expedition, was slipped into each of the county conventions, but was really not much discussed by the people.

So the members from Marion county will be exasperated if they do not fall over each other in the wild rush to vote for a fair appropriation.

Better get rid of it at a special session.

But Governor Geer and Marion county men better not promise too swiftly to stand by that game, unless the Portlanders are willing to give the people the referendum on it.

The Portland people could see no merit in a special session until they saw a chance to feather their own nest for the fair appropriation.

But even that would be a cheap price to pay for a reform that would put our government in order.

**THE CLEVELAND POSITION.**  
It is useless for the Democrats to talk about nominating Grover Cleveland for president.

He would never come within a million votes of being elected.

**OUR SALMON IN GERMANY.**  
United States Consul Monaghan, at Chemnitz, Germany, has the following under the caption "Oregon Salmon in Germany":

In the consular report for June, which has just appeared:

"During a recent conversation with a hotel proprietor of this city, I learned that Oregon salmon was sold in Germany to a very limited extent. This gentleman believes that a large business can be done in this particular fish, if special attention is given to transportation. He said he had eaten the fish and found it delicious. Inquiries as to price showed that Oregon salmon could be bought for 14 marks (35 cents), while German salmon cost at the present time 5 marks (about \$1.25) per pound. He also said that the fish were frozen in Oregon and shipped in this frozen state to Europe. It is claimed that if the fish were in cold water and then cooked the fish retains its flavor.

If the above is correct, there can be no doubt that this empire would make a very good market, as there is hardly any fish worth eating that can be had here for less than 40 cents per pound. The packers of Oregon salmon should look into the matter. A distributing house could be established in Hamburg or Bremen, which would attend to the shipping of the fish to the inland German cities and towns.

**THE MEANING OF IT.**  
(Portland Daily Journal, June 18.)

Assuming the sincerity of the originators of the act of providing States sovereignty, we look to the act itself to discover its purpose.

The preamble recites that, "Whereas it is desirable that the people should have an opportunity to instruct their senators and representatives in the legislative assembly as to the election of a senator to congress, from Oregon, therefore," and then follows the law providing that a vote shall be taken upon nominations made in the manner provided by law. This looks very fair. The law received the support of the legislature, without, we believe, any opposition.

But the originators were not sincere. They did not believe it was desirable for the legislature to be instructed by the people when they controlled the legislature. The preamble was a piece of political bunkum. It was to be used by them if the emergency required, but it was not foreseen that it was capable also of being used against them. Hence when a popular vote has been taken in strict accordance with the law framed by themselves, it is discovered that the vote is a farce.

He has compelled the parents of the boy to disown and discontinue to public view the hypocrisy of the little crowd that mean to run the politics of the state, without regard to any far-fetched popular vote. He has shown to the people that in the view of the machine the people are a farce. Machine men like these are not in favor of the election of senators by the people. When they say so they are an imposture. It is they who say in their preamble that it was desirable that the legislature should be instructed by the people. When they get the legislature they don't need any instructions. They won't accept any, nor tolerate any. To venture such instructions is "a colossal conceit." To accept a nomination in pursuance of a law of the state and to receive substantially the unanimous vote of the legislature as an instruction to the legislature is interfering with the prerogatives of the machine, which reserves the right to itself to name the United States senator without instructions or suggestions from anybody else.

Mr. Geer's vote is, however, giving the machine some trouble. That is evidenced by the perpetual scolding he is getting. But what has Mr. Geer done that draws upon him this tirade of abuse? He is the only candidate for United States senator. But there are others. He did not make speeches for Mr. Furnish. But Mr. Mitchell, the darling of the ring, fought the regular party two years ago, and by the votes of Democrats whose election he secured sits in the senate today.

We are not advertising Mr. Geer for the senate. Our purpose is only to draw attention to the fact palpable to the common sense of the people that it is to kill him off in the interest of the candidate of the ring. Any other person who shall have the temerity to be a candidate will be attacked in a similar manner. The ring means to clear the field of rivals.

When the ring "asks for bread it will not be pleased with a stone." Now we are advised, at least in part, who is the stone. The question is, Who represents the bread? Whom indeed would the ring be pleased with? It knows. Nobody else does.

**Before Peace Was Signed.**  
A Parliamentary paper issued at London on June 2, gives the correspondence preceding the peace agreement. From this it appears that General Schalkburger, acting president of the Transvaal, informed Lord Kitchener March 12 that he was prepared to make peace proposals. A month later the Boer delegates submitted propositions. April 13 the war secretary, Mr. Brodrick, refused to entertain any proposition based on the independence of the republics. Subsequently President Steyn, of the Orange Free State, and General Schalkburger and Botha declared that the surrender of independence must be submitted to the burghers in the field. The British government expressed surprise at this attitude, but announced its willingness to accept the Boers' surrender on the same terms that Lord Kitchener had previously offered General Botha, and to give facilities for a consultation of the Boer commandos.

May 17 General Schalkburger and Mr. Steyn informed Lord Kitchener that the burghers assembled at Vereeniging had empowered a commission to negotiate peace terms, subject to ratification at Vereeniging. Lord Milner, Lord Kitchener and the Boer commission met May 29. The latter offered to surrender the independence of the republics as regards foreign relations, to surrender part of their territory and retain self-government under British supervision. These proposals were forthwith rejected.

The same day Lord Milner, General Smuts and Judge Hertzog drew up a plan of agreement to be submitted to the conference at Vereeniging for an armistice or a vote. This was very similar to the final agreement, and with few alterations was approved by Mr. Chamberlain, who, in giving notice of his approval, told Lord Milner he must inform the Boers that unless it was accepted within a fixed limit of time the conference would be considered ended and His Majesty's government would not be bound in any way by the present declarations. The Boers asked to be allowed until Saturday night to give an answer, and the result was seen in the termination of the war. The last message of Lord Milner to Mr. Chamberlain, June 1, after the signing of the peace agreement, mentioned that Mr. Steyn's name was omitted from the signatures because he was too ill to come to Pretoria, adding that he had already taken his parole. General De Wet signed for the Orange Free State delegates because Mr. Steyn nominated him "acting president" on retiring from the conference.

The news of peace in South Africa was communicated to the Boers in the enclosure on Hawkins Island on June 1st. The prisoners were delighted, and received the news with great enthusiasm, shouting, singing and hurrahing. Some of them rushed wildly about embracing every English soldier they met, and said: "Yesterday we were free, but today we are friends." Drunks were served out to the Boers on Hawkins Island, and the rejoicing there continued until a late hour.

The Boers on Tucker's Island also received the news with great joy. When the fact of peace was communicated to them, the prisoners went fairly wild, shouting and singing the "Fokkies" and other hymns until 1 o'clock in the morning. At reveille the band of the Warwick regiment moved up to the Tucker Island enclosure and played "Auld Lang Syne," "Old Hundred" and "God Save the King," and in all of these airs the prisoners joined most heartily. The peace news was received by the prisoners on the other islands with similar manifestations of joy.
