Taken Recess for Summer

The Greater Salem Commercial Club has abandoned regular meetings until after the summer season closes. The next meeting will be held on the second Wednesday in September. There is \$300 in the club's treasury, and the executive committee will audit all bills pending against the organization. During the vacation Judge Johnson, who is the vigorous secretary of the club, will attend to all correspondence, and will accept no salary for his three months' services. The club will resume active work in the fall, and expects to carry to a successful issue many of the propositions that have been under consideration.

Geer's Vote for Senator

The published official returns of the late state election do not disclose the vote on United States senator, as that vote is required to be transmitted to the legislature with the vote for governor. It is as follows: Geer, 44,697; Wood, 32,627; scattering, 156. As the vote for Furnish and Chamberlain was something over thirty-nine thousand each, Governor Geer received five thousand more votes than Furnish. As the friends of some of the other aspirants for the Senate did not vote for Geer, he considers that he received a very complimentary vote. Geer is the first man who has ever received a majority of the popular vote for the United States Senate on the Australian ballot.

State House Inundated

This forenoon, by some defect in the water service at the state house the closets on the second floor were flooded, and a great deal of inconvenience, and some damage, was suffered. Plumber Murphy was sent for, and soon had the floods shut off, that for a time threatened to inundate the building with sewage.

Burglary Charge Dismissed. After hearing the testimony in the case of the State vs. Grover Lewis, who was charged with burglary, the complaining witness being John Darling, Justice O'Donohue this morning dismissed the charge, and ordered the defendant released from custody. Lewis was charged with entering a building and stealing an overcoat and a pair of gloves. It was a petty case, and should not have been brought to court.

More Wedding Permits. John J. Fuchs and Mary Fessler procured a marriage license today. A state license was issued on the 11th ult. to A. T. Gilliam and Martha Hale. The marriage ceremony in the last instance was performed by Rev. Dollarhide on the date of the issuance of the license.

Strawberry News. (Hood River Glacier.)

The price of strawberries Thursday, as we go to press, ranges from \$1.25 to \$2 a crate, according to quality. Service to the mountain patches, where picking has just commenced, are coming in in fine shape, and command the highest price.

N. C. Evans' place is among the earliest for berries in Hood River. His first crate this season sold for \$7.50, and he had marketed 600 crates before the price dropped below \$2. When asked the average price of 600 crates, he said he didn't want to make a statement for publication; that he told R. C. Judson one time that his crop netted him one season 16 cents a pound. He cleaned up from one acre of ground that season \$900. This statement was published in the O. R. & N. Co's literature, and went all over the country, and some people might have thought he prevaricated.

Strawberry growers in the Underwood neighborhood of the White Salmon are demonstrating that strawberries can be grown without irrigation. As high as 250 crates a day were shipped from this section during this season, and they are still shipping 50 to 60 crates a day. Their berries are early and get the big prices.

F. G. Church, on Monday, picked 67 crates of strawberries from his patch of 1/2 acre. It is estimated that his 1/2 acre will yield 400 crates. His berries are large and fine. The Union paid him \$3 for a crate Monday that went to Portland for a banquet to the Mystic Shrine. Each box of the crate contained only three tiers of berries, or 37 berries to the pound.
