SPECIAL SESSION PETITIONS. Much as the people generally distrust and fear a session of the legislature, they are rolling in the petitions for a special session.

When the organs of the politicians and grafters are opposing the proposition of enacting flat salaries, the people, regardless of party, are demanding this reform.

Petitions have been received since the last report from citizens of Wilhoit, Clackamas county; Fairfield and Scotts Mills, Marion county; forty citizens and business men of Independence, Polk county; citizens of Salem and Gervais; of Gervais, Macleay, Pratum, Marion and Suver.

The above have been transmitted to Governor Geer and placed on file, and new petitions are being circulated by scores of persons.

When it is considered that without cause the Oregonian opposes the special session, lies about it, and tells the people it is not needed, and all its little yapping echoes are also saying so, it is remarkable what an interest is manifested in the matter. A regular session the people look upon with dread and foreboding. This special session they are begging for.

AN OBJECT LESSON IN GOOD GOVERNMENT. The city of Salem put all officials on a flat salary, and put all fees and perquisites in the treasury, and went from an annual deficit to a cash surplus and wiped out \$50,000 of debt.

The Marion county Republicans did the same, and wiped out \$100,000 debt, and reduced the county tax nearly three mills.

If the state government will do the same in accordance with the sentiments of the Marion county Republican platform, the state tax will be reduced one-half in four years.

That is the opinion of a conservative man as Tilmon Ford, who is not a boomer Geer for senator, but is a big taxpayer, and a lawyer of some standing. He stamped for Furnish, too.

With the flat salary law in effect, and all fees and perquisites in the treasury, the state officials would get \$25,000 a year less, and would still be well paid. Anything wrong in that?

With the fees and perquisites going into the state treasury the state would be taking in \$25,000 a year, where it is now paying out \$25,000 a year in excessive compensation to the state printer, and for salaries on boards and commissions.

The state run as Salem and Marion county are run, the taxpayer would be \$50,000 a year ahead, or \$200,000 in four years, and that can only be accomplished by calling a special session.
