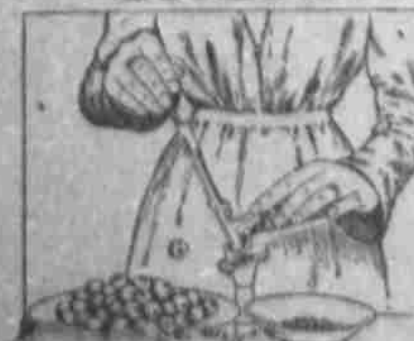

HOW THESE THINGS ARE DONE.

On the part of many respectable Republicans there is supreme disgust over the appointment of Jack Matthews as United States marshal for Oregon. If it had been known that such was the purpose of the Republican managers a stronger protest than that which resulted in the defeat of Furnish for governor would have been registered on election day.

But all such deals are made in the dark, and this was part of the deal that was to shelve Governor Gore, nominate Furnish for governor, retire Senator Simon, and make Scott senator.

While the people have undone the first part of this program, and given Gore a majority for senator, Matthews gets his reward in the fattest office in the gift of the party, and Scott is yet to be rewarded.

We do not state any secret when we say that Mr. Scott went to Washington early in the spring and made the deal with Mitchell, Hanna and probably Roosevelt by which Mr. Matthews was made marshal, and by which Scott is to have the delegation from Portland for United States senator.

That explains the adulation of Roosevelt, while McKinley got only roasts and insults. It explains why the Oregonian praises the crowd it always seared unmercifully. It is nothing but personal politics, and poor Furnish was put up to be bid and slaughtered after he had served the managers with cash enough to carry the Multnomah primaries.

It is the way things are done in these days by the organizers for self and the disorganizers of the Republican party. It is useless to complain when the power is in the people, but unfortunately they are often deceived, and appealed to from standpoints that are only a masquerade. There is not a particle of principle or honest purpose in the whole thing.

CIRCUIT OF TEACHERS' INSTITUTE

Such a Plan is Proposed in Willamette Valley

As a means for promoting the success of teachers' institutes and making possible the employment of prominent educators of national fame for lectures, it is proposed to establish a circuit of county teachers' institutes in the Willamette valley. The educators of Marion, Linn, Polk, Yamhill, Benton and Jackson counties have already become interested in the enterprise. By the proposed arrangement, it is planned to hold the several county institutes in close succession, in an order that would offer a convenient itinerary for those desiring to attend all of the meetings. In this way the expense of conducting the several institutes could be minimized, and at the same time the efficiency and value of these conferences would be increased. One or more competent Eastern lecturers, of national reputation as educators, could be engaged, and the expense thereof divided among the several institutes. The expense of getting a lecturer here from the East has been greater than any one county could afford.

If the scheme is finally decided upon, the circuit will probably be held in the fall. Further announcement will be made of the project when lecturers in the East can be communicated with and engaged.

Two Divorces Are Granted

On Tuesday afternoon Circuit Judge Boise granted two divorces, as follows: Minnie M. Hamilton vs. James E. Hamilton, and L. E. Cline vs. Wm. M. Cline. In the divorce case of W. L. Hunsacker vs. Mary Hunsacker, the court allowed defendant only \$50 for attorney's fees and expenses.

In the divorce suit of Edward A. Jory vs. Josie Jory, the demurrer of the defendant to the plaintiff's complaint was argued and overruled.

One route, covering 27 miles, and serving about 85 families, has been established, and the people of that section are elated with having received the service, which was only granted after hard work of more than a year. The receipts of the state land board for the month of June, as shown in the monthly statement of Clerk Chamberlain, were \$35,240. The amount was credited to the several funds as follows:

Common school fund principal payments on certificates and cash sales of school land, \$28,69.67.

Common school fund principal, payments on sales of lands acquired by deed or foreclosure, \$1230.15.

Common school fund principal, sale of tide land, \$70.48.

Common school fund interest, payment on certificates, \$3320.74.

Common school fund interest, rents and payments on sales of lands acquired by deed or foreclosure, \$1413.35.

University fund interest, rents and payments on sales of lands acquired by deed or foreclosure, \$150.

Agricultural college fund principal payments on certificates and cash sales of school land, \$402.57.

Agricultural college fund interest, payments on certificates, \$28.88.
