

This may be considered a startling statement, but it is an absolute fact. One year ago, when the ditch was being extended through the residence district, wells for a considerable distance in either direction were drained of their contents. This shows that the soil is porous, and that impurities must collect in the wells, which can only be a source of considerable contagion, and the direct cause for a good share of the sickness in the community. The natural conditions under which the water supply collects refunded if it does not satisfy you in these wells, and the fact that it remains stagnant until drawn out, makes the aqua doubly harmful. These same conditions have not been dis closed in the suburban districts, since it has not been necessary to sink the ditch so deep as was required in the down-town sections. This is a strong argument for hydrant water, and sug-


