King to Go Aboard Yacht. The progress of King Edward toward recovery is maintained, and it is understood that he will be transferred to the royal yacht Victoria and Albert at Portsmouth at noon Tuesday.

Lord Salisbury Resigns. London, July 4.-The fact of the esignation of the premiership of Great Britain by Lord Salisbury, as foreshadowed in the dispatches, was officially given out last evening. The prime minister laid down the respon-

sibility of his office July 11th. Within 24 hours his majesty elevated A. J. Balfour, the government's chief representatives in the House of Commons, to the position of premier, While it was expected in political and commercial circles that Lord Salisbury's retirement would be coincident with the coronation of King Edward, it was scarcely looked for rior to that event. Consequently about the only surprise expressed as the news spread through London concerned the date rather than the fact of the resignation. The real interest was not so much in reference to Lord Salisbury's withdrawal as it was in the appointment of his successor.

Other Changes Certain. The change in the premiership will involve other ministerial changes. As no office is vacant except that of the keeper of the privy seal, the present cabinet can carry on work as long as will lead in the House of Lords.
