MERRILL'S BODY HAS BEEN FOUND

Where He Was Murdered By the Fiendish Tracy

Has Been Identified By Warden Janes of the Oregon Prison

Dressed As He Was When Last Seen With the King of All Living Outlaws

(Daily Star Special to Capital Journal) Seattle, July 15.—Merrill's body was found by a small boy named Roberts, yesterday near the main road, below Chehalis, the place described by Tracy.

Portland, July 15.—Merrill's body was found yesterday. The discovery was kept secret until the arrival of Warden Janes, of Salem.

Body Undoubtedly Merrill's. (Chehalis Bee-Nugget Special to Capital Journal.)

Chehalis, July 15.—A body, undoubtedly Merrill's, lies behind a log on a back country road four miles southeast of Chehalis. It was thrown over the log, and is doubled up. The body had on the clothes in which Merrill was last seen alive.

The Victim of Tracy.

The finding of Merrill's body exactly corresponds with the story of his killing as given out by Tracy himself. The men had some words, and Tracy killed him with a little compunction as he would a mosquito that had become troublesome.

Supt. Lee Notified.

On Monday afternoon Superintendent Lee received the following message from Sheriff Edward Deggeler, of Chehalis, Lewis county, Washington: "In case Merrill's body is found dead, will reward be paid?"

This confirmation, in part, at least, of Tracy's story leads to the belief that the dead man is Merrill, but his identity cannot be positively established until Warden J. T. Janes reaches Chehalis.
