WORDS FOR YOUNG REPUBLICANS.

The first of a series of papers by a young Republican has attracted a great deal of attention among thoughtful readers. The writer uses as good language as is found in the able editorials.

It is the truth, as he says, that about all the business the party has had for its young men is to whoop and holler a few times before election, and then if they want anything to turn them over to a cold-blast civil service competition.

It is the young men who do the greatest things in any city or state. Edison, as a young man, electrified the world with inventions. It is young Santos-Dumont who is solving the problem of the airship.

Sir Isaac Newton was but 23 when he made his greatest discovery of the law of gravitation. He was set to inquiring what made the apple fall. So Young Republican is inquiring into the Oregon political windfall.

With Oregon spending \$50,000 a year on a top-heavy system of official emoluments—that would build beautiful parks and highways that would benefit society—the young men do well to begin making inquiry.

Gen. Grant, at 39, took command of the Chinese army. Grant called McKenzie the finest cavalry commander in the Union armies at 21, and Napoleon, at 27, carried the bridge at Lodi. Oregon needs the ardor and intelligence of her young men at the front, especially in political affairs.

### SOLICITOUS FOR GEER.

Some of the papers that oppose the special session claim it is only a scheme to defeat and injure the political aspirations of Governor Geer.

If that were true we should think all the Furnish-Scott-Fulton combination would be for the special session, but they are not. They are all more or less in doubt about it, and mostly fight the proposition. Listen to this:

"There is a scheme back of this special legislation business, and we feel confident that one of the principal objects is to use it for the purpose of killing off Geer. The editor of The Journal will get as much, if not more, glory out of such a measure passing the next regular session of the legislature than he would if a special session were called with this object in view. If he were a true friend of Governor Geer he would not be manufacturing thunder for the governor's enemies."—Aurora Borealis.

The Journal does not view this matter from the standpoint of whether it will help or hurt Mr. Geer, or any other person. We do believe that a special session to enact a flat salary law is what the people expect at the hands of the Republican party, or else hold it responsible for the failure to put into effect a much-needed reform that it has now for the second time in its history promised the people.

Any true friend of the Republican party ought to be able to see that what is involved in the whole controversy—not the helping or hurting of any individual.

If Governor Geer calls a special session, presents the matter right, and the reform goes into effect, it will help the whole people, the party and the man who does it. It may not make Geer senator, but certainly no man can be made senator who is not in favor of this reform. We do not believe Mr. Fulton wants to be senator at the price of breaking party pledges.

### AN IOWA ASSOCIATION.

The formation of an Iowa Association at Salem should be completed at an early day. There will be an immense immigration from Iowa to the Pacific coast, and this section must get its share.

We would like to hear from Iowans now in Oregon, with suggestions as to how best bring about an organization. Let a simple blank be prepared by some one, setting forth the purpose of such an organization.

The Journal will print it, and persons favoring such a move can sign their names and postoffice address, and thus a nucleus of an organization can be secured. The matter is in the hands of our readers who hail from the grand old Hawkeye state, now the most powerful and influential state in the nation.

A movement has been started in Lane county, and we would like to see other counties take it up, until there are many Iowa associations formed in Oregon.

With counties organized, it would naturally follow that a state association be formed, as the Ohioans have already done Oregon proud in that line, and we could all gather and sing, "Best Be the Tie That Binds" the Hawkeyes and Wolfpack together in love and harmony.

RAPID GROWTH OF TRUSTS.

It is said that prior to 1887 the total capitalization of all the industrial corporations having more than \$1,000,000 capital each was \$170,000,000. Between then and 1888 86 new companies were formed with a total capitalization of \$1,141,000,000, or an average of \$13,500,000 each, and in the years 1888, 1889 and 1900 149 such companies, with a total capitalization of \$2,784,000,000, or an average of \$36,900,000 each. "The capitalization of the last three years is more than two and one-half times that of the 11 years preceding."

At the present day there is a continuation of this remarkable expansion.
