### ROUGH GOODS POPULAR.

New Weavers of Zibellae—Bright Colored, Latest Appliques.

Zibellae is a clever make, but still rough and hairy, is revised for autumn and winter wear, but the looser texture now so readily that they will not be repeated this year. Himalaya is a rather poetic name for a rough goods powdered with white dots which are irregular in shape and produced in the weaving process.

The introduction of bright velvet on gray and white, albatross is quite Parisian, but requires to be skillfully treated, and on some gowns the bright line of the velvet is subdued by silk passementerie or braiding. Braiding of the fine westerly order, grouped lines of stitching and narrow tubular head arranged in scrolls and tails or applications of head in motifs and placements

are quite the fashionable trimmings for tailor made gowns, but velvet is almost invariably introduced in addition. All neutral shades of the leather type are popular, and these contrast admirably with the bright colors now in vogue, of which the most chic are esmerald red, bright orange and orchid pink. Sometimes the only touch of velvet consists in a collar and belt of brown or green on mastic or antelope color, and the same vivid color is worn on the hat.

The three-quarter coat shown is of mastic faced cloth trimmed with oriental embroidery. It is collarless and has a double cape with rounded edges. The sides are confined in a belt of the embroidery, which is passed under the straight front piece. The hat is of braided felt and velvet and trimmed with a single white ostrich plume.

The sleeves are laid in folds to a little above the elbow, where they flare in a huge puff, which is gathered in its turn into a tight fitting cuff of embroidery and lace. The skirt is divided into panels by means of open stitching, and there is a box plaited dounce headed by three folds.
