The crop has failed in five largely populated districts as a result of drouth, which has lasted five months. The richer Chinese, taking advantage of the famine, have cor nered the rice supply, and have raised the price to four cents per pound. The Chinese Henevolent Society has, there fore, cabled to their over sea branches asking for money, which will be used in the purchase of rice in Siam and the Straits Settlements for sale at a rate which the poor will be able to meet.
