King Edward's Birthday.
London, Nov. 8.—King Edward will be 61 years old tomorrow. Beyond the customary salutes and display of flags over the royal residences, there will be no observance of the anniversary, the general celebration of His Majesty's birthday being deferred until May 30th, in accordance with a wish expressed by the King upon ascending the throne. The King will pass the day at Sandringham, where he has continued to reside since his return from his northern trip, with the exception of a few short intervals spent in London.

King Edward's imperial nephew, the German Emperor, arrived at Sandringham today, and will remain there during the coming week. He is accompanied by a small suite, including the imperial chancellor and two physicians. Though the visit ostensibly is purely a personal one, there is every reason to believe that the meeting of the two monarchs will result in important international understandings, especially as regards South Africa, and more particularly Delagoa Bay, which is so vitally important to Great Britain as an outlet for her newly-acquired colonies. The presence of King Edward of Portugal, in England gives strength to this surmise concerning the importance of Emperor William's visit. The Portuguese government, it is understood, is willing to transfer some portions in South African territory to British rule. Germany, however, is understood to be strenuously opposed to British trade securing such an advantage, at any rate unless Portugal is willing to placate Germany, by granting her some similar concession, and it is believed that before the Emperor and King Carlos leave England a bargain will be arranged.

Probably no non-political subject has been so much discussed in New York this year as the standard of the plays produced at the theatres. Now it has become known that the Actor's Church Alliance has planned a crusade against immoral dramas. The Alliance has appointed a committee to determine what plays in New York are fit for religious men and women to witness. The committee is composed entirely of clergymen who will collect information concerning new plays and send it to pastors of churches of every city in the country. These men in turn, with sympathetic influential members in their congregations will know quietly among the people and induce them not to visit the objectionable plays when they come to town. The men who constitute the committee are well versed in dramatic literature and will be able to judge the merits of plays without actually witnessing their performance.

A movement which has attracted much attention in Roman Catholic circles is afoot among Roman Catholics who are college graduates to organize an association for mutual improvement. Some of the most prominent men in the church are interesting themselves in the effort.

There are nearly a million and a half persons over the age of 10 resident in the United States who cannot speak the English language, exclusive of 72,000 Indians. This number is about two per cent of the total population. The largest number of non-English speaking persons is found in New York, where they number 225,000. Pennsylvania, Illinois and Texas follow, the latter having a considerable Spanish speaking population. The state which has the smallest number of non-English speaking residents, is South Carolina, with 65 only.

The professional gambling element will soon be making its reappearance in the stock market. For want of anything better to do it annually gravitates to Wall street after the close of the racing season. Its accounts are greatly coveted by a certain class of speculative commission houses. Brokers who, in the summer time, spend considerable time and money around race-tracks and at Saratoga are not always above mixing an ulterior motive with their sport. There has been sharp competition lately for the gambling element's speculative business and two houses that hitherto have had most of it are likely to have to share it with a prominent Wall street firm. The beauty of the racing people's accounts is that they are moderately active. And then, too, the money is always there.
