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Boats Run To Corvallis Beginning today, the steamer Peonias will run through to Corvallis for the first time since June, says the Portland Journal. For the past four months she has been going no further than Salem, and on account of low water it has been very difficult to go there even. Corvallis is 48 miles beyond Salem, and will require two days to make the round trip from Portland. It is 118 miles from here, and is one of the longest steamer trips in the West. The principal towns passed on route are Oregon City, Butteville, Newberg, Salem, Independence, Albany and Corvallis. STATE NEWS ITEMS.
