Henry Ward Beecher

London, Nov. 28 .- Dr. Joseph Parkr, the famous pastor of the City Temle, who has been ill for several weeks,

known as "Dr. Parker of the City Temple," was the leading Congregational minister in England, and has ever been a prime favorite with Americans abroad. Dr. Parker established the City Temple in 1869, and during the years that have passed since then he has developed an important work among the poor of the great city. Few pulpit orators were more outspoken or more fearless than the celebrated British divine. He has several times attracted attention by his bold criticisms of King Edward when he was Prince of Wales, and since he has asended the throne.

Dr. Parker made a tour of the Inited States in 1887, and at that time was frequently mentioned as a successor to Henry Ward Beecher, of whom he was a deep admirer.

St. Petersburg, Nov. 28 .- Tremendous effect has been produced in Russia by the unanimous demand of the agricultural inquiry commission for constitutional reforms and political liberty as the foundation of economic well being. In spite of Minister Witt's encouragement to speak boldly "because the Emperor wants to know the exact truth," the minister of the interior, Von Plowe, has begun arresting the members of the commission, including among them a physician named Martincy, for the authorship of the resolutions presented to the local committee of Veronzhe, demanding a national congress, and two other members of the agricultural commission named Michaelovik and Nikoviv. of Tula, for advocating a remission of the peasant land payment.
