

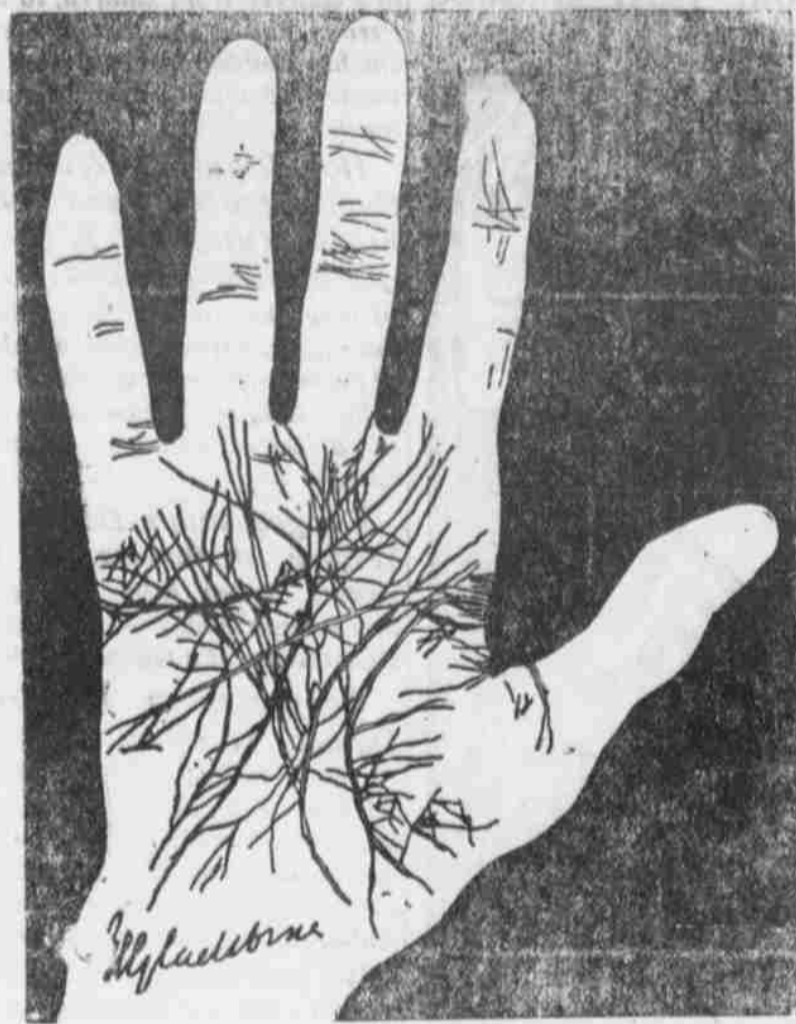

## TRI-STATE BILL

### Raises a Fight in the Senate

#### A Single Statehood Convention Meets

#### National Gathering of Warehouse Association

Claremore 1 T., Dec. 3.—It is accepted as a foregone conclusion that the inquiry Senator Beveridge and his fellow-committeemen from the Senate Committee on Territories have been making through Oklahoma, New Mexico and Arizona, will appreciate a fee-for-all fight on the Statehood question when the bill comes up in the Senate next week. The bill before the Senate is known as the Tri-State bill and provides for the admission of New Mexico and Arizona to Statehood and the creation of a single state out of Oklahoma and Indian Territories. The tri-state bill was the result of the efforts of Mr. Flynn, the delegate from Oklahoma, who felt so sure of its passage by the Senate and he declined a renomination to the House, with the intention of being one of the first Senators from the new state.

In both Oklahoma and Indian Territories, however, there is a large element which is strenuously opposed to combining the two into one state. They favor single Statehood and are working hard to promote their cause. Citizens of Oklahoma object to the joint Statehood proposition on the ground that the Indian Territory is far behind their territory in progress, development and civilization, while a large element of the Indian territory people are of the opinion that Oklahoma would have all the best of it in the combination deal.

The single statehood advocates of the two territories have decided to come together for the promotion of their plans. To this end a single statehood convention, composed of nearly 500 delegates from each of the two territories assembled here today. The purpose of the convention is to frame a bill that will be introduced as a substitute for the omnibus bill, and which will provide for the making of a single state of the territory of Oklahoma and the Indian Territory.

#### To Discuss Warehouse Needs.

Washington, D. C., Dec. 3.—The annual convention of the American Warehousemen's association, which began here today and will continue through the rest of the week, will consider many subjects of interest to those engaged in the storage-warehouse and refrigerating business. The association represents a capitalization of over \$50,000,000, with a membership of nearly 100, including all the leading warehouse people of the country.

A committee is on hand from the convention of State commissioners on uniform laws, with a view of obtaining the opinion of the association as to legislation governing the issue of storage warehouse receipts. The laws governing such receipts are so varied and conflicting that they seriously interfere with the proper conduct of the storage warehouse business. It is urged by the members of the association that the storage warehouse receipts ought to be good collateral, but this is impossible, it is declared, until uniform laws are enacted in all the states.

Another important matter to receive attention at the convention is the subject of fire insurance. The rates fixed by the various tariff associations have been very unsatisfactory, and in many instances the cold storage men have not been able to secure sufficient fire insurance at any price.

Sealed proposals will be received by the Board of Trustees of the Oregon State Reform School until December 22, 1902, until 10 o'clock a. m., then publicly opened, for furnishing all or any part of 800 cords of body fir wood and 400 cords second growth fir wood. The conditions are that the wood shall be cut while green, from sound timber, well seasoned and closely corded, without bulkheads; delivery to begin not earlier than May 1st, and to be completed not later than October 1, 1903 and to be delivered at the main building of said school. Bidders for 200 cords or over, if accepted, will be required to furnish, within 10 days from acceptance, a bond in the amount of the bids. Bids shall be in sealed envelopes, endorsed "proposals for wood," and addressed to the Superintendent of Public Instruction, Salem, Oregon.
