FEVER AT PRISON

Two Deaths Have Aiready Resulted

Only a Few Cases at the

Two deaths from typhold fever have resulted at the Oregon state penitentiary. The first convict to defeat his sentence was Ed. Cantowine, who was serving an 18 months' sentence for larceny in a store, committed in Umatilla. He was received in January, 1902, and died on December 17th On Sunday morning last Andrew White, who was serving a five years sentence for manslaughter, committed in Multnomah county, also died from the same disease.

A total of 20 cases of typhold fever have been or are now being treated at the prison. Of that number 16 are now under the care of the prison physician, Dr. W. A. Cusick. Only three of the 16 are considered in a serious condition, the rest being convalescent. William Heitmiller, of Tillamook county, a five-year man, is in a critic al condition, and may not live. Among the others that have contracted the fever are Frank McDaniels, up for 15 years from Multnomah.

The prevalence of this fever at the prison naturally suggests the inquiry as to its origin. Superintendent Lecreports that the sanitary conditions about the institution are good, and an aspection of the apartments shows that they are kept scrupulously clean. The sewage system is claimed to be adequate for the needs of the institution. The superin'endout further reports that none of the water from Mill creek is used for drinking or cooking devoted to the needs of both prisoners and officers. In view of this fact, it is contended that the blame for the fevthe water. It is the opinion of Superintendent Lee that the cause of typhoid fever at the prison may be traced more directly to the unusual climatic conditions that prevailed in this locality throughout the fall, in that there has been an absence of the usual frosts, and all vegetation has passed through a store of partial de-When the fever first appeared at

meet the needs, the new kitchen was converted into a hospital. As the number of sick prisoners increased Superintendent Lee states that he employed additional help, including a day and night nurse, and took every precaution to prevent the further spread of the disease among the prisoners, and also provided the patients with every attention that the treatment of the fever required. The diet of all the prisoners was changed as a means of preventing further contagion, and no expense has been spared by the prison management to handle prisoners that has taken the fever is not unusual, being less than 7 per cent. The bfennial report of Superintendent Lee, now in the hands of the state printer, will show that during the 21 nonths covered in the report there was not a single death in the prison from sickness. This is an exceptional record, and goes to indicate that conditions at this institution must be iealthful.

Many Cases in Reform School. Superintendent Bickers, of the state reform school, reports that during the past six weeks there have been 26 cases of typhus fever at the school, with no deaths. Of that number only

three were seriously ill. This is an unusual record.

Few Cases at Asylum. With a population many times greater than any of the other state institutions, the insane asylum has had a fewer number of cases of typhoid fever than either the state prison or ward for any case of Catarrh that canthe reform school.
