FLAT SALARY BILLS

Are Introduced in Both Houses

Have Been Referred to the Judiciary Committee

Although the flat salary question promised to become about the most important measure of this session, it has not yet received much attention. Early in the session Senator Miller presented his measure, which fixes the salaries of the governor, secretary of state and state treasurer, and the state printer, but did not mention the court officials. Representative Kay has now a bill providing for all of the above officials, excepting the state printer. This is on account of the resolution relating to the printer, which passed last session, and which considerably curtails the expense of that office. Mr. Kay's bill places the salaries at amounts totaling \$29,500. He mentions matter of the secretary of state filling the position of the governor during the absence of the latter, so makes their salaries the same, while the Miller bill gives \$500 difference. Both have been referred to the judiciary committee.
