### STATE BOILER INSPECTOR

### Office Demanded By Mine Operators

### Was Indefinitely Postponed by the House

When the bill creating the office of state boiler inspector and providing for the licensing of engineers (H. B. 150) came up for passage Mr. Kay made a motion that it be indefinitely postponed. He said that all persons interested in the measure or all those owning boilers of any description, on their own part looked after the safety of the same, and there was no need to have a state official for this purpose.

Mr. Eddy next spoke. He said in part: "What excuse is there for the passage of this bill? What right has anyone to tax every engine in the state, in the city, or in every mountain logging district or every traction engine? It would also be taxing the man who runs the engine at \$5 per year, and another \$5 per year to keep this license in operation. Who demands the passage of this bill? The men who run the engines do not. It only makes another office to be filled, with headquarters at the state house, and requires the payments of a handsome salary, that would come by taxes imposed upon people not concerned in the matter."

Mr. Hale said: "It is time to call a halt in this matter of appropriations. We cannot provide office for every office-seeker in the state, even if we created the office of hen-coop inspector, or a few more. This calls for an appropriation that should not be made. It provides that all engineers now employed would have to cease operations until they take a license, and is an unjust measure."

Robbins of Baker was the principal speaker in favor of the measure. He said there were a thousand mine laborers in Eastern Oregon who demand that licensed engineers be placed in control of the hoist engines, their lives being at the mercy of those persons."

Cornett replied that if the miners demand such action, the measure should apply only to them and not hoist an impossibility upon the rest of the state.

The motion to postpone prevailed.
