INDIAN BOY KILLED

Run Over By Train Near Gold Hill

Wm. Hayes was killed Friday night at Gold Hill, by being run over by a train. Another boy, Jos. LaFumboise, had run away with Hays from the Salem Indian school Wednesday night. Superintendent Campbell went to bring back the remains of the dead boy, and also the other boy, who was arrested. Hays was from Alaska, and about 15 years old. He will be buried at the Indian school cemetery.
