TONGUE'S SEAT IN CONGRESS

Fight in This District To Be Warm

Will Be Many Men in the Field

The air is full of talk among the politicians about the probable man to succeed the late Thos. H. Tongue in this congressional district as representative of Western Oregon in congress.

The people in the country are doing very little talking, but are interested in the various moves that are being made. They want to know all they can about the candidates, and have the greatest freedom of expression in choosing a candidate.

It is conceded on all sides that Marion county has an opportunity to get the nomination, unless this county is considered too far north, geographically, in the district. It is admitted that a good Marion county candidate, with some second choice following in the rest of the sixteen counties, could be nominated and elected.

A Veteran Talks. Hon. R. D. Hume, of Curry county, who was a member of the lower house for a number of sessions, and two years ago voted for Binger Hermann sixty odd times for senator, has written a number of letters saying that he has made up his mind to favor a new man for congress, and he mentions Harris, Eddy and Davey as suitable timber, in his opinion. As he comes from a heavily timbered county, he is considered a judge of that commodity, in a political sense.

Mr. Kay's Attitude. Hon. T. B. Kay, of Marion county, is not a candidate, although he has friends in several precincts who would like to send delegations to the county convention for him. He is recognized as a pretty sagacious man in sizing up a situation and accomplishing results. He says he will not be tied up hand-and-foot to any candidate in this or any other county, but wants to go to the convention perfectly free to nominate the best man for the place, all things considered, whether he hails from Marion county or some other county. He thinks there is a chance for Marion county to name the man, but, at all events, he believes Marion county occupies a pivotal position, and could make the choice for the district, when it comes to a close show-down as between numerous aspirants. He has not yet decided to take a hand as between the local candidates, but says the convention should decide that, and then go to work to nominate the choice of this county, if, after agiving at the convention, it is believed there is a fair

his own county, and, if nominated, would undoubtedly poll more than the Republican vote, and his good old French name would appeal to the voters in every part of the district. He is certainly worthy of consideration. —Lincoln County Leader.

Hon. Percy R. Kelly would be an ideal congressman, young, active and full of vigor, he would make a record for efficiency and usefulness not only for himself, but for the entire district. Senator Kelly has not announced his candidacy, but has received many letters from friends throughout the district urging him to allow his name to be used. A solid delegation from Linn county will demand his nomination, and after June 1, 1903, it now looks like Congressman Kelly, of the first Oregon district.—Albany Herald.
