EASTERN OREGON FIGHTING

Circulating Petitions for Referendum

Is Against the Fair Appropriation and Corporation Tax

And Also Against Portage Railway Appropriation

The Baker City Democrat, which is the most rabid of the papers demanding the referendum expresses its opinions in the article following:

The enthusiasm is widespread throughout Baker City and Baker county over the invocation of the referendum of the people for the repeal of the recently enacted corporation tax law and portage railway bill. Everybody is signing the petitions, and word comes from Union county and from Southern Oregon that the enthusiasm is there just as great as in Baker county. The people are learning that the last legislature is not one which entirely represented them. Many laws are passed which are objectionable to the masses.

It is desired, and it is almost obligatory, that the merchants and ordinary business men sign these petitions. The interests of part of the state are at the eastern part of the state are at stake. Capital will not come here and invest when it is burdened by such laws. The fact is perfectly apparent that the largest industry of eastern Oregon is being clinched for the purpose of building a toy thrown as a sop at some of the politicians and grangers in the middle Columbia river counties. There is as much use for a portage railroad as there is for a fifth wheel on a wagon. The United States government is now at work building a canal between The Dalles and Celilo, which is the only true solution of river transportation to the inland Empire. When you use a portage railway and have to break bulk twice in transit from the interior to the point of shipment, you destroy the profits gained by river transportation over rail.

Taking From the Mines.

Then why take \$165,000 from the mining interests and throw it into a hole at The Dalles, when it is known to every responsible engineer that \$165,000 will not build one-half of the projected road? The bill, furthermore, provides nothing for terminal facilities and nothing for the operation of the road when it is completed. By the time two or three successive legislatures have been convened and have appropriated money for the deficiency in the construction of the proposed road and some \$500,000 of the people's money will have been spent and the road put in operation the United States canal will have been completed. The mining men of this state are a unit in their opposition to both bills, swiping money out of one industry to support another.

It will be seen when the next general campaign comes on in the state of Oregon that the people will take a hand in the distribution of their own money. They want to support the legitimate industries of the state. Mining is the chief industry and a portion of the Willamette valley and the middle Columbia counties stand in the middle to the two gold producing sections of Oregon. Wheat growing, sheep raising and cattle producing are all great industries. Allied with them are the manufacturing interests. All must have a fair show, but it isn't fair to tax to death the young mining industry of the state and prevent foreign capital and foreign companies from developing these latent resources. Thinking men know where they stand on these propositions.

The Other Side.

The Democrat according to the opinions of those taking an opposite view, starts off with entirely false premises, and therefore, reaches entirely erroneous conclusions. It premises that all the money that is to be raised by the tax on incorporations is to come from the mining companies, while as a matter of fact all incorporations are treated alike, and there is a vast number of them outside of the mining business. In the second place, it assumes that the money so raised is to be spent for the purpose of building the portage railroad at Celilo. This is simply absurd. The money for the portage railroad is appropriated from the general fund, and the Democrat might as well stogie out any other fund or expense to charge with the responsibility of being the dumping ground for the "money wrang from

the mining industry." It might as well say the incorporation tax was to be dumped into the Lewis and Clark fair fund, or that it was to be squandered in paying the Indian veterans it might go further and say that particular money supported the state penitentiary, or asylum, and for that reason ask that those institutions be abolished. Of course, whatever money is raised from the corporation tax goes into the general fund, and the expenses of running the state come out of that fund. Then again the Democrat assumes that the road cannot be built for the appropriation, and yet reliable men offer to complete the work and guarantee to do so inside of the amount. As to its being useless, there the Democrat is again at fault. Its completion would cut the freight rates on millions of bushels of grain and other products of the inland Empire, and would save the people its cost, in moving one crop. If this is doubted, let the Democrat examine the rates on wheat from The Dalles where there is opposition, with the rates at Grant, Arlington, Blalocks and other Columbia river points where there is none. Let it examine the wheat rates from The Dalles, before and after the portage road at the Cascade Locks was built.

Again, without going into any attack on the mines or mining industry it is claimed that a tax on incorporations would serve to keep out moneyless companies and that if a company cannot pay for its incorporation from

\$50 to \$200, it will not benefit the mining industry to have it around, in fact it would be a benefit to have such kept out, for there are entirely too many of that kind of concern in existence now. It might be added that the fight against the incorporation tax bill, if that was what was hurting the mining section, has been begun without judgment and managed without skill. A glance shows that the whole referendum matter has now got into the regular log-rolling stage, where the friends of any of the measures will naturally combine and pass all in order to protect the one they want. Abuse of the portage railroad, which is really the most meritorious of all the measures carrying big appropriations that was passed by the recent legislature is not going to swell the vote against the corporation tax, but will serve to make friends of the portage road make common cause with its friends. It is perhaps well that all these questions should be voted on, but people differing from the miner's idea, believe in acting dispassionately.
