FOR THE MONTH OF MARCH

City Recorders Report for Month and Quarter

Thirty-one Violations of Ordinances in Ninety Days

At the regular meeting of the city council this week City Recorder Judah submitted reports for the month of March and also for the quarter ending on the 31st ult. The report for the month of March show thirteen cases in the police court with fines paid amounting to \$20 and 70 days served under commitment, During the month receipts to the amount of \$517.75 were received while the warrant indebtedness for the month was \$2136,35.

The quarterly report of Recorder Judah for the three months ending March 31st shows a total of \$71.60 in fines collected and 160 days served under commitment. During the three months thirty-one cases were disposed of in this department of the city government. These cases were classified as follows: Drunkenness, 19; idle and dissolute, 8; disorderly conduct, 2; roaming the streets, 2; In the three months two criminal cases were heard in which the fees aggregating \$15.65 are due and owing the city from the county. The total receipts for the three months were \$2154.25 from the following



Emperor, Washes Men's Feet.

Vienna, April 9.- Emperor Francis Joseph today petrformed the annual Holy Thursday foot-washing ceremonial in the presence of the courtiers and the diplomatic corps. After washing the feet of twelve aged men in commemoration of Christ's washing of the feet of His discloles his Majesty served them with dinner and sent them away with gifts of money. The imperial archdukes assisted in the ceremony.

The ceremonial of Maundy Thursday, the day before Good Friday. dates back as far as the fourth century, and is supposed to have been a mandate from the New Testament-John xiii., 34, "to wash each other's feet." It was the early practice for prelates or other eminent persons to wash the feet of twelve beggars on that day. The Pope himself still performs the ceremony by command of the missal the Austrian Emperor.
